

1 [Declaration of Election Results.]

2 **Resolution declaring the results of the November 4, 2003 Consolidated Municipal**
3 **Election.**

4 WHEREAS, A Consolidated Municipal Election was conducted in the City and County
5 of San Francisco on Tuesday, November 4, 2003, which placed before the electorate
6 candidates for Mayor, District Attorney and Sheriff, and fourteen City and County ballot
7 measures; and,

8 WHEREAS, John Arntz, the Director of Elections of the City and County of San
9 Francisco, has certified to this Board of Supervisors the results of the Consolidated Municipal
10 Election, a copy of which is contained in file 031894 of the Board of Supervisors, and which is
