# Mellon Grants Snapshot

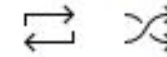
\$2,000,000 for two-year period (January 2022-December 2023)

# Achievements

- Created publicly searchable GIS map of available library services for incarcerated people
- Held convenings of librarians in 2022 (approximately 55) and 2023 (approximately 90)
- Implemented year-long virtual training series on library services and incarceration
- Released white paper on technology, digital literacy, and incarceration
- Promoted grant work through conference presentations and lectures

Revised existing ALA Standards for library services to people who are incarcerated (ALA-based)

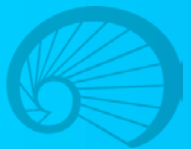
- Standards will be published and distributed to librarians in 2024 (not updated since 1992)



# Continuing Efforts

---

- Coordinating 2024 convening of librarians (estimate attendance: 150)
- Ongoing research on existing library services for people who are incarcerated
- Updating publicly searchable GIS map of available library services for incarcerated people
- Promoting year-long virtual training series on library services and incarceration
- Sustaining advisory committee composed of people impacted by incarceration to identify service needs
  
- Developing digital library programming focused on reentry (ALA-based)

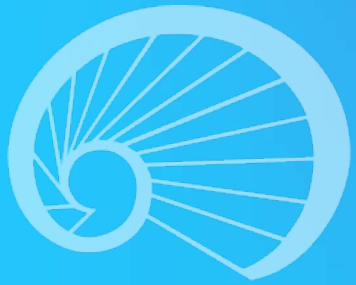


# Impact of Project

---

- Increase services for local library patrons impacted by incarceration (including after sentencing and in the process of reentry)
- Strengthen connections between local and national grassroots support networks
- Improve library and information access for incarcerated people nationwide
- Provide nationwide support and training for librarians providing or hoping to provide this work
- Create data-driven reports that identify models that work
