# AMENDED IN COMITTEE 2/27/2020 ORDINANCE NO.

FILE NO. 191073

NOTE:

Ordinance amending the Health Code to require the Medical Examiner to report information to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, and Director of Health each once every four months regarding deaths arising from drug overdoses.

[Health Code - Monthly Medical Examiner Reports of Drug Overdose Deaths]

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Article 4 of the Health Code is hereby amended by adding Section 227, to read as follows:

### SEC. 227. REPORTS REGARDING DRUG OVERDOSE DEATHS.

(a) Preparation of Overdose Death Report Form. By no later than June 1, 2020, the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner shall develop a form on which any person filing a death certificate may provide information regarding whether the decedent died from causes related to overdose of drugs. The form shall seek the following information regarding each decedent: the decedent's race, ethnicity, age, and sex; the cause of death; the drug or drugs that contributed to the decedent's death; the date of death; the San Francisco neighborhood in which the decedent resided, if the decedent was a San Francisco resident; and whether the decedent was homeless.

- (b) Filing of Overdose Death Report. At the time of registering a death by filing a death certificate with the Department of Public Health under Article 4 of the Health Code and California Health and Safety Code Sections 102775 et seq., the person registering or reporting the death shall also submit to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner an Overdose Death Report in the format prescribed in subsection (a) of this Section 227.
- (c) Reports to Mayor, Board of Supervisors and Department of Public Health. By no later than October 15, 2020 and by the 15th day of the month every four months thereafter, the 15th day of each month, the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner shall transmit to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, and the Director of Health, a report stating the number of individuals whom the Office determined in the preceding calendar month to have who were reported to have died from causes related to overdose of drugs in Overdose Death Reports that the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner received in the preceding four months. To the extent possible without disclosing the identity of any decedent or releasing information in violation of any state or federal law, the report shall provide the following information regarding each decedents in aggregate form, divided by calendar month: the decedent's race; ethnicity; age; and sex; the cause of death; the drug or drugs that contributed to the decedent's deaths; the calendar month when the decedent died; the San Francisco resident; and whether the decedents resided, if known the decedent was a San Francisco resident; and whether the decedents was were homeless.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

### **REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

(Amended in Committee February 27, 2020.)

[Health Code - Medical Examiner Reports of Drug Overdose Deaths]

Ordinance amending the Health Code to require the Medical Examiner to report information to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, and Director of Health once every four months regarding deaths arising from drug overdoses.

### **Existing Law**

Existing law does not require the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to report information about deaths arising from drug overdoses to the Board of Supervisors or the Mayor.

Existing law requires people filing death certificates with the City to submit a report to the Department of Public Health with additional information when the deceased person was homeless at the time of the person's death.

### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would require people filing death certificates with the City to submit a report to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) with additional information when the deceased person died of causes arising from a drug overdose. The report would include information about the decedent's race, ethnicity, age, and sex; the cause of death; the drug or drugs that contributed to the decedent's death; the date of death; the San Francisco neighborhood in which the decedent resided, if the decedent was a San Francisco resident; and whether the decedent was homeless. The ordinance would require OCME to make available a form that people could use to prepare the report.

The ordinance would require OCME to submit a separate report once every four months summarizing aggregate information about deaths arising from overdoses, based on the information provided in the individual reports received by the OCME.



# Proportion of Monthly Drug Overdose Deaths Identified for 2018 by Date of Data Retrieval




2019 Retrieval Date Cases Identified on 25 January 2019 (1 month after end of 2018)




# Opioid, Cocaine, and Meth Overdose Death Counts in San Francisco 2014-2018
