

1 [Contract funds to evaluate the impact of a resource center for drug users.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health, Community**  
4 **Behavioral Health Services (SFDPH,CBHS), to enter retroactively into an agreement**  
5 **with the University of California San Francisco (UCSF), the primary contractor, and**  
6 **expend funds in the amount of \$4,697 to provide research evaluation services; for the**  
7 **period of July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004.**

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9 WHEREAS, UCSF is the recipient of a grant award from the Department of Health and  
10 Human Services, National Institutes of Health, for a program titled, Evaluating Impact of a  
11 Resource Center for Drug Users; and,

12 WHEREAS, UCSF, and SFDPH,CBHS have agreed to enter into a subcontract  
13 agreement to participate in this project; and,

14 WHEREAS, UCSF has agreed to reimburse SFDPH,CBHS in the amount of \$4,697  
15 from this award under the terms of this subcontract agreement; and,

16 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, UCSF requires SFDPH,CBHS to  
17 enter into an agreement (The "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the  
18 Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_, which is hereby declared to be a part of  
19 this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

20 WHEREAS, The subcontract budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$110; and,

21 WHEREAS, This Resolution requires expedited review by the Board of Supervisors  
22 because we did not receive the subcontract until February 2, 2004; and,

23 WHEREAS, Resolutions authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of grant funds  
24 may be placed automatically on the consent agendas in committee, as they are usually

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1 considered to be routine items, and this resolution authorizes the acceptance and expenditure  
2 of grant funding; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That SFDPH,CBHS is hereby authorized to enter retroactively into a  
4 subcontract agreement in the amount of \$4,697 with UCSF, the primary contractor; and, be it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
6 Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

7 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the position funded  
8 under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when the  
9 agreement expires.
