12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

14 Section 1. Article X of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
15 revising Section 5.10-1, to read as follows:

17 **SEC. 5.10-1. ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP OF FOOD SECURITY TASK**
18 **FORCE.**

20 (e) **Purposes of Task Force; Strategic Plan.** The Food Security Task Force shall
21 recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and city-wide strategies that would
22 increase participation in federally funded programs such as Cal Fresh known nationally as
23 SNAP and formally as food stamps, Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food
24 Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition
25 Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), the School Lunch Program, and the National

1 School Breakfast Program. The Task Force shall also provide general advice and assistance
2 to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and City
3 policies on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents in
4 addition to any other issues within the Task Force’s expertise.

5 To accomplish these goals, the Food Security Task Force shall assist the Department of
6 Public Health in preparing and presenting the food security and equity report to the Board of
7 Supervisors and the Mayor as such report is established by the City pursuant to Administrative Code
8 Chapter 59A shall prepare an annual assessment of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San
9 Francisco. The report may include recommendations for funding, programs, and policy. ~~The~~
10 ~~Task Force shall submit the hunger and food insecurity assessment to the Board of Supervisors.~~ The
11 Board of Supervisors may adopt legislation to implement the recommendations.

13 Section 2. Article X of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
14 revising Section 5.10-2, to read as follows:

16 **SEC. 5.10-2. SUNSET.**

17 Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Task Force, this
18 Article X shall expire by operation of law, and the Task Force shall terminate, on July 1,
19 ~~2021~~2024. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article X to be removed from the
20 Administrative Code.

22 Section 3. Effective Date; Partial Retroactivity.

23 (a) This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs
24 when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Food Security Task Force Sunset Date Extension]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to extend the sunset date of the Food Security Task Force from July 1, 2021, to July 1, 2024, and to reference among the Task Force’s duties assisting with the Department of Public Health’s Food Security and Equity Report.

Existing Law

The Food Security Task Force (“FSTF”) was established to recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and City-wide strategies to increase participation in federally funded programs that would address hunger and enhance the food security of City residents. The FSTF is also tasked with preparing an annual assessment of the state of hunger and food insecurity in the City. The current ordinance authorizing the FSTF expires on July 1, 2021.

Amendments to Current Law

This proposed ordinance would extend the expiration date of the FSTF from July 1, 2021 to July 1, 2024. The proposed ordinance would also amend the FSTF’s requirement to prepare an annual assessment by instead requiring the FSTF to assist the Department of Public Health in publishing the Department’s biennial Food Security and Equity Report. The ordinance authorizing the biennial Food Security and Equity Report is also pending approval by the Board of Supervisors, File No. 210568.
