[Supporting the California Children and Families First Initiative] SUPPORTING THE CALIFORNIA CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FIRST INITIATIVE TO FUND EARLY CHILDHOOD HEALTH PROGRAMS BY ADDING AN ADDITIONAL FIFTY CENTS TAX TO EACH PACK OF CIGARETTES SOLD IN CALIFORNIA.

WHEREAS, Studies have shown that the emotional, physical and intellectual experiences of children up to the age of three years have a profound effect on brain growth and development; and,

WHEREAS, Children who do not receive adequate health care or nutrition, or who are subjected to neglect or abuse, do not develop at the rate of their peers and are thus behind when they enter school. Children who do not overcome such disadvantages are more prone to drug use and involvement with gangs as they go through school; and,

WHEREAS, Smoking by pregnant women presents a significant risk to fetal development, and exposure to second-hand smoke represents a major cause of illness for infants and young children; and,

WHEREAS, Public agencies provide a range of programs to serve children after they enter school, yet only minimal funding is available for programs which provide services for children under three years old; and,

WHEREAS, The California Children and Families First Initiative will create the first major statewide program focused on delivering services most needed by pregnant women and families with children, specifically children under five years of age, including: pre- and

postnatal maternal and infant nutrition services; child immunizations, child care skills for parents and caregivers; domestic violence intervention, prevention and treatment; child development, health care and social services not provided by existing programs; and education and training on the avoidance of tobacco, drugs and alcohol during pregnancy; and,

WHEREAS, The California Children and Families First Initiative will provide funding for these programs through imposition of a fifty cent tax on each pack of cigarettes sold in California; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports the California Children and Families First Initiative to fund early childhood health programs by adding an additional fifty cents tax to each pack of cigarettes sold in California.
