[Supporting Senate Bill 1140 Allowing Voters to Register and Vote Up to and Including on Election Day

Resolution supporting Senate Bill 1140 to delete the arbitrary timelines which prevent eligible citizens from voting in elections by allowing voters to register and vote up to and including on Election Day.

WHEREAS, Every citizen has a right to vote and should have access to our polls on

Election Day; and

WHEREAS, The voter registration process in the United States is too often a barrier to voter participation; and

WHEREAS, In 2006, only 76 percent of the voting-age population was registered to vote: and.

WHEREAS, California is 41st out of 50 states in voter turnout; and,

WHEREAS, Research has shown that election-day registration can boost voter turnout

considerably – up to 7 percentage points; and, WHEREAS, Eight other states allow citizens to vote without pre-registration. Six states

Idaho, Maine, Minnesota, New Hampshire, Wisconsin, and Wyoming – have successfully

used election-day registration for years and have increased their voter turnout even as the

national average continues to fall. In North Carolina, citizens can register and vote at any polling site during the early voting period. North Dakota requires no registration; and,

WHEREAS. Under existing law, California citizens must register at least 15 days prior to an election in order to vote; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1140 (Yee) will delete the arbitrary timelines which prevent eligible citizens from voting in elections by allowing voters to register and vote up to and including on Election Day; and

WHEREAS, The new standard would be phased-in in coordination with the introduction of VoteCal, a statewide online database of all registered voters; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors supports SB 1140, urges the California Legislature to pass SB 1140, and urges Governor Schwarzenegger to sign SB

1140 into law.
