3 **Resolution approving the San Francisco Unified School District revised expenditure**
4 **plans for the Public Education Enrichment Fund.**

6 WHEREAS, Charter Section 16.123-2 establishes the Public Education Enrichment
7 Fund (the "fund"), and designates one-third of the fund for universal access to preschool, one-
8 third for sports, library, arts and music programs and the remaining one-third of the fund, or in-
9 kind services of equal value, for general education purposes; and,

11 WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco have advanced the San Francisco
12 Unified School District the FY 2006-07 fund requirement of \$13.3million from the General
13 Fund in FY 2005-2006; and,

14 WHEREAS, the San Francisco Unified School District has submitted a revised
15 expenditure plan that meets the prescribed uses of the fund as outlined in the Charter; and,

16 WHEREAS, the Controller's Office has reviewed the expenditure plans and has
17 provided comment to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

18 **RESOLVED**, By the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco that
19 it does hereby approve the revised expenditure plan, as proposed by the San Francisco
20 Unified School District, for fiscal year 2005-2006.




