Resolution adopting the recommendations of the City Non-Profit Contracting Task Force.

WHEREAS, On October 26, 2001, the Board of Supervisors created the City Nonprofit Contracting Task Force to review City contracting policies and procedures and to make recommendations to the Board to improve and streamline contracting practices for non-profit health and human services organizations; and

WHEREAS, On September 26, 2002, the Task Force submitted a report to the Board of Supervisors that contained a number of recommendations to improve contracting procedures for non-profit health and human services; and,

WHEREAS, On June 26, 2003, the Task Force submitted a report to the Board of Supervisors that contained an implementation plan for the recommendations previously submitted; and,

WHEREAS, The objectives of the recommendations include: consolidate contracts, where appropriate, across or within departments; develop methods to streamline contract approvals and increase automation; develop and process contract documents early in the cycle to assure timely payment; create a review/appellate process to implement and oversee substantive changes to standardization; eliminate unnecessary requirements imposed on contractors; develop methods to facilitate electronic processing of contracts and payments; create standardized and simplified contract forms; establish accounting standards for non-profit contractors; coordinate joint program monitoring, whenever possible; develop standard monitoring protocol, language and definitions to more clearly define contract requirements; provide training for personnel who monitor contracts to ensure adequate knowledge and

understanding of programs and services; conduct tiered assessments of programs to more efficiently evaluate program performance; and fund annual cost of living increases for non-profit contractors; and,

WHEREAS, Improving and streamlining the contracting procedures for non-profit human and health services will improve services to San Francisco residents; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors adopts the recommendations of the City Non-Profit Contracting Task Force and will work toward achieving the objectives of the Task Force recommendations; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board requests that City Departments submit progress reports to be reviewed at biannual public hearings before the appropriate Board committee.
