For many years I worked with Ed Roberts, during that time, the World Institute on Disability, in Oakland, California, was awarded two grants of excellence by the federal government, one on the area of Independent Living and the other on Personal Assistance Services. Ed, is considered the Father of Independent Living and is the greatest international symbol of deinstitutionalization. He was paralyzed from the neck down, a quadriplegic for 45 years, yet led a normal life with his own help, in his own home. I served as Special Assistant to Ed Roberts, and I traveled the U.S., and the world as a WID Fellow, teaching and learning about attendant care, for all disabilities and the aged, from all different cultures, all over. Partners in Policymaking, that I was a part of, has trained 25,000 disabled people, and parents of disabled children in skills necessary to survive. Dr. Colleen Wieck, from Minnesota was the co-developer of Partners, and has a web page rich in Ed Roberts disability history.

Business and/or professional experience:

As I mentioned above, I worked along with Ed Roberts, as a WID Fellow. I also worked traveling with Ed, doing his driving, all of his reading, on the road correspondence, and served as his representative in Washington, D.C., and in Sacramento. I was a co-founder of the California Democratic Disability Caucus, the first in the country, and was also an organizer of the first large meeting of disabled people from all over the United States, at the 1996 Democratic Convention in Chicago, Illinois. Ed sued U.C. Berkeley, for admission over 50 years ago, because they didn't accept cripples. He was H.S. Valedictorian. I accompanied Ed, to all Union, Disability, Aging, and Political events, his closest friend. He put Berkeley on the map as the most progressive city in the world, with the highest per capita number of people with disabilities, a far cry from the headline declaring, "Helpless Cripple Attends Cal". I enabled Ed to accomplish many things most quadriplegics can't fathom.

Civic Activities:

While I am both a senior and a cripple, I have served for over 50 years, both the elderly and disabled populations, whose problems are almost identical. Long Beach, California was a large retirement city, where I saw seniors treated better than I have ever seen them treated again. I was an elected shop steward, and state and federal representative. Ed modeled the Independent Living Centers, run by cripples, on the Labor Union model. There are several thousand all over the world, and I served as Ed's personal Independent Living Center inspector, et al.

The photo shown below is Ed Roberts and Don Galloway, over 50 years ago, when Ed became the first disabled student at U.C.Berkeley after a lawsuit. What progressed was the first disabled student college program in the U.S., the first Independent Living Center in the world, after which several thousand have been established all over the world. I am Ed's personal ILC inspector.

The second photo, Ed's wheelchair, a 1978 one-of-a-kind, pioneering chair, that I took to the Smithsonian, which wrote of Ed as a "Great Reformer". Ed has been described as the Martin Luther King of Disability, Internationally, as the Mahatma Gandhi of Disability, all while paralyzed from the neck down. Along with Ed's son Lee, and Dr.Colleen Wieck, I am the Organizer of events surrounding the California State Holiday honoring Ed Roberts, January 23rd.

I represented him also, at his induction into the California Hall of Fame. Dr. Bill Bronston, stated that "There has never been anyone like Ed before." Attorney Jack Harrison, said "Ed is like the world's first talking dog, no one has ever seen anything like him before, and they are therefore astounded." I worked with Ed, all over California, the United States, and the World.

I took my first training in Homecare over 50 years ago, AARP in Long Beach, California, so I have spent a lifetime helping crippled and elderly people, without compensation, particularly with Ed Roberts. Most of my references are now dead, I worked for many years in Sacramento and Washington, D.C. on these issues, and initiated a Congressional Investigation in New York, into the largest case of Corporation Healthcare Fraud in American History, some years ago.

Ed Roberts's wheelchair, about 1978

Outfitted with the type of seat used in Porsche automobiles and a large headlight for traveling at night, this motorized wheelchair captures the unique personality of a man who dedicated his life to securing rights, freedoms, and improved quality of life for people with disabilities. Ed Roberts, who was paralyzed by polio at a young age, began his activist career in 1962 when he fought for the right to attend the University of California at Berkeley. He went on to help establish the first independent-living centers for disabled people in the United States and traveled the world campaigning for disability rights. Roberts died in 1995, and after a memorial service held for him in Washington, D.C., friends wheeled his chair to the Castle and left it there with a note explaining that this donation was a tribute to Roberts's "amazing life." The unexpected gift has inspired curators to research the history of disability and seek new ways to include people with disabilities in the Smithsonian's story of America.

I am a Senior Peer Counselor and involved in many advocacy activities for the disabled and seniors. I feel qualified for services on the IHS Public Authority

I was also elected President for 15 years of the largest condominium on the East Coast with 120 units

On behalf of the IHSS Public Authority Governing Body, I write to recommend Melvin Beetle to fill Seat #10 (Consumer over the age of 55, authorized to represent organizations that advocate for aging people with disabilities). (Note: The previous occupant of the seat, Ethel Richardson, is deceased.) I join with our Governing Body officers to unanimously commend Mr. Beetle's appointment to you. He has already impressed us with his knowledge of and dedication to issues affecting low-income older adults and people with disabilities in San Francisco.

Mr. Beetle was a Senior Action Network (SAN) volunteer and vice president of the Senior Homeless Task Force. He was the only formerly homeless member of the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness Council for San Francisco and has volunteered at many senior centers. He also served 10 years in the Peace Corps, and as a training officer, he trained the first deaf, blind and physically disabled Peace Corps volunteers. He currently works as a Senior Peer Counselor, handling referrals from the Canon Kip Senior Center.

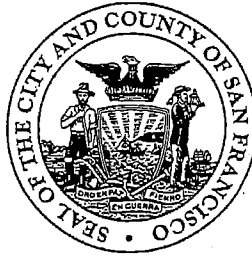

Administrative Code, Chapter 70, and California Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 12301.6 (Ordinance Nos. 185-95; 67-00, 55-05, and 213-08).

Board Qualifications:

The governing body of the In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Public Authority shall be composed of thirteen (13) members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors shall solicit recommendations for appointment of qualified members through a fair and open process, including reasonable written notice to, and affording reasonable response time from, the IHSS Authority, members of the general public, and other interested persons and organizations. No fewer than 50 percent (50%) of the membership shall be individuals who are current or past users of personal assistance services paid for through public or private funds or who are recipients of IHSS.

Membership categories on the governing body shall be as follows:

1. Two (2) consumers over the age of 55 years, each authorized to represent organizations that advocate for aging people with disabilities;
2. Two (2) consumers between the ages of 18 and 60 years, each authorized to represent organizations that advocate for younger people with disabilities;
3. One (1) consumer at-large over the age of 55 years;
4. One (1) consumer at-large between the ages of 18 and 60 years;
5. One (1) worker who provides personal assistance services to a consumer;
6. One (1) Commissioner from the Human Services Commission, recommended to the Board by the Commission;

7. One (1) Commissioner from the Commission on the Aging, recommended to the Board by the Commission;
8. One (1) Commissioner from the Public Health Commission, recommended to the Board by the Commission;
9. One (1) member of the Mayor's Disability Council, recommended to the Board by the Council;
10. One (1) member representing the bargaining unit of the union that represents IHSS independent providers; and
11. One (1) consumer at-large who is 18 years of age or older.

The IHSS Public Authority shall provide assistance in finding personnel for the IHSS Programs through the establishment of a central registry and related functions, and to perform any other functions, as may be necessary for the operation of the Authority, or related to the delivery of IHSS in San Francisco.

Initial appointments of both the consumer and worker members shall be made from a list of recommendations based on applications designed by, and submitted to, the IHSS Task Force of Planning for Elders in the Central City. The governing body of the Authority may make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for establishing procedures for consumer and worker member appointments. Every attempt shall be made to assure that each appointee will be able to serve the full term to which he/she has been appointed, in order to ensure continuity in the work of the Authority.

After the terms of the initial period are complete, each appointment to the governing body shall thereafter be for a three-year term. A member may be reappointed, but may not serve more than a total of nine consecutive years on the governing body. The initial appointment periods shall be staggered as follows: Three (3) one-year terms; Four (4) two-year terms; and Four (4) three-year terms. Upon appointment, members shall draw lots to determine the length of each member's initial term.

Qualified applicants must reside in San Francisco and have: familiarity with, or knowledge of, personal assistance services; the capacity to understand their role to aid and assist the Authority in the administration of its duties; and the ability to attend regularly scheduled meetings, which shall occur only in facilities which meet disability access requirements.

Report: The Authority shall submit an annual report to the Board of Supervisors detailing its functions and evaluating its operation for that year. In addition, such report shall present the Authority's specific goals and objectives for the coming year and its plan for meeting those goals and objectives.
