In solidarity with the Mid-Sunset Neighborhood Association (MSNA), SPEAK is strongly supporting a coordinated response to the PCE contamination on the Irving Street corridor.

This resolution urges the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) to treat the now five areas with documented high levels of tetrachloroethylene (PCE) near 26th-27th Avenues and Irving:

- 1- In a coordinated manner
- 2-Involve the Department of Public Health
- 3-Ensure that the toxins are remediated, not simply modified or mitigated
- 4-Keep action levels completely consistent with those typical in California at 1/1,000,000 people becoming ill, being the threshold for action.
