4	20.52 to restructure the Delinquency Prevention Commission to reduce the number of

6	the Board of Supervisors, establish minimum educational background or experience
7	criteria for appointment, provide for two members between the ages of 14 and 21 years
8	of age unless there are no satisfactory persons available, and require that the
9	Department of Children, Youth and Their Families provide staff and administrative
10	support.

14	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
15	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
16	Sections 20.50, to read as follows:
17	Sec. 20.50. DELINQUENCY PREVENTION COMMISSION; ESTABLISHMENT;
18	COMPOSITION; PURPOSE.
19	Pursuant to the provisions of Section 233 of the Welfare and Institutions Code of the
20	State of California, there is hereby established a Delinquency Prevention Commission ("
21	<u>Commission")</u> composed of <u>19 11</u> citizens, to coordinate the work of those governmental and
22	nongovernmental organizations engaged in activities designed to prevent juvenile delinquenc
23	within the City and County of San Francisco. Each individual Supervisor on the Board of
24	Supervisors shall appoint one commissioner to the Commission.
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1	The Commission is to review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors
2	("Board") on possible legislative and budgetary actions regarding: (1) the coordination of City
3	agencies and community-based organizations aimed at the prevention of juvenile delinquency; (2) the
4	allocation of City, state and federal funding for the prevention of juvenile delinquency; (3)
5	programmatic changes to improve the cost-effectiveness and quality of care of programs and services;
6	and (4) any other matters pertaining to the prevention of juvenile delinquency referred to it by the
7	<u>Board.</u>
8	Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
9	Section 20.51, to read as follows:
10	Sec. 20.51. MEMBERS' APPOINTMENT; TERMS; EXPENSES; VACANCIES.
11	Members of the Delinquency Prevention Commission shall be appointed by the Board
12	of Supervisors to serve a term of four years, and they shall be reimbursed for their actual and
13	necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The Commission shall have at
14	least five members who have advanced degrees or at least five-years experience in: (1) law
15	enforcement or criminal justice, (2) social services, (3) mental health, (4) education, and (5) medicine,
16	respectively. At least two of the remaining members of the Commission shall be persons
17	between the ages of 14 and 21 years of age unless there are no available persons able to
18	carry out the duties in a manner satisfactory to the appointing Supervisor. Upon a vacancy
19	occurring in the membership of the Commission and upon the expiration in the term of office
20	of any member a successor shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. When a vacancy
21	occurs for any reason other than the expiration of a term of office, the appointee to fill such
22	vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor.
23	Section 3. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
24	Section 20.52, to read as follows:
25	Sec. 20.52. FUNDING.

1	The Department of Children, Youth and Their Families shall provide staff, administrative
2	support, and other services to the Commission as needed. The Board of Supervisors may, subject
3	to the budget and fiscal provisions of the Charter, provide funds to pay for such staff
4	personnel services and facilities as may be reasonably necessary to enable the Delinquenc
5	Prevention Commission to exercise its powers and perform its duties under the Welfare and
6	Institutions Code. The Board may designate the City and County department or departments to
7	provide staff service to the Commission where appropriate.
8	Nothing in this provision shall prevent the Commission from receiving and expending
9	funds from other governmental and nongovernmental sources to assist the Commission in
10	carrying out specific projects designed to accomplish its objectives.
