have served one term in CDCR facilities and Sacramento jail. I have also been jailed in two out

of state municipal facilities, in which I was cited and released.

3. What was your experience transitioning back to San Francisco after having been incarcerated? What helped you? What were the barriers?

Like most released prisoners, my experience transitioning back to San Francisco has been difficult. The principal barriers for me have been surviving financially while trying to secure housing and employment. In addition, I have struggled with dealing with the stigma of my incarceration and felony record in my community.

A long-time San Francisco resident, I found no available or affordable housing options for me in San Francisco. I therefore had to decide to change my parole to a county outside of San Francisco in order to stay with family. Unfortunately, the burden of frequent parole department visits to the home became upsetting to my family. Not wanting to burden them further, in 2009 and 2010 I sought housing in a shelter in San Francisco where I stayed for a period. Since that time, I have again moved back in with family, and am very fortunate because of that. But seeking shelter in San Francisco was a very hard experience. It gave me valuable insight into the acute dearth of housing for the formerly incarcerated in San Francisco.

After my release from prison, I struggled for almost two years to find steady full-time employment but was unable to, due to my felony record and the state of the economy. Recently, I finally secured full-time employment as an AmeriCorps member for the Women's Community Clinic in San Francisco, a clinic where I have volunteered since my release from prison. Many of the women we serve have been incarcerated and I feel very fortunate to be of service in a public health capacity to a community that I definitely consider myself part of.

I am now a proud VISTA volunteer at the San Francisco Health Department, where I work in quality improvement projects in service to the Tom Waddell Clinic's largely homeless patient population. Many of this clinic's patients are formerly incarcerated, and I am extremely pleased to be in service to them. I am acutely aware of the need for traumainformed care for the formerly incarcerated; as I see that daily in the patients we serve.

4. How can we help other people transition from prisons and jails more successfully? How can we help people permanently exit the criminal justice system?

To help people transition more successfully, we need to have well-developed reentry programs that begin in prison and jails, and which link prisoners to healthcare, community services, job prospects, and housing possibilities very early on and far prior to release. Currently, although some prisons have some pre-release planning, many other facilities have little or none.

Upon release into the community, prisoners should be met with community-initiated assistance that addresses the healthcare, substance abuse treatment, housing, and employment needs of former prisoners in a well-coordinated and sustained way. This should include services specifically for women.

It is critical to contemplate the families of prisoners in this process and address their needs and the dynamic of family reunification. This is particularly true for women prisoners reentering San Francisco, as over 2/3 of women prisoners are caregivers of their children immediately upon release.

We also need to support education and training of service providers who assist former prisoners. In particular, I think many community services fail to contemplate or adequately address the traumatization of incarceration and the effects of that traumatization on individual and family health. We need to profoundly improve the knowledge base of local service providers in regards to the residual effects – both physical and mental – of living in a coercive environment over time.

5. What do you hope that the Reentry Council will achieve?

I hope the Reentry Council will continue its efforts to engage victims, former prisoners, service-providers, local residents, and correctional and law-enforcement authorities in a consistent, constructive and productive collaboration to support former prisoners in rebuilding their lives – and staying out of the system permanently.

I especially hope the San Francisco Reentry Council will take leadership in advancing a more developed knowledge base in the community on the situation of former women prisoners. The conditions of confinement are markedly distinct for women prisoners in California, and profoundly different than that of our male counterparts. As a result, the effects of incarceration are also markedly distinct.

I am eager to help the Reentry Council to not only more effectively engage former women prisoners in Council activities, but also to educate and train service providers as to the challenges women face both in prison and in reentry.

To Whom It May Concern,

We are Professors of Law at Stanford University and Co-Directors of the Stanford Criminal Justice Center, the University's research and policy program dealing with issues of criminal law and sentencing. We are writing to strongly support Mr. Michael Santos's petition for parole release. The key facts are in the record before you: Mr. Santos will have served more than 25 years for a nonviolent drug crime; he has no history of weapons or violence; he has a good disciplinary record; and he has achieved many educational accomplishments during his time in prison.

Let us emphasize that while both each of us has been involved in criminal justice studies for over 30 years, neither one of us has ever before written a letter supporting any action for any other prisoner. We have always trusted the parole and clemency systems to operate by their traditional criteria. But Mr. Santos's case is so amazing and compelling that we are making a unique exception for him.

One of us (Professor Petersilia) has long been acquainted with Mr. Santos and indeed has made classroom use of documentation of his life, record, and imprisonment to enhance student's understanding of the possibilities of rehabilitation. In addition, as former Director of the RAND Corporation's Criminal Justice research unit and head of the Center on Evidence-Based Corrections at the University of California, Irvine, she has spent much of her career evaluating and refining empirical models for predicting recidivism. And on the basis of her and others' research, Mr. Santos can be seen as the safest possible candidate for release, someone who poses virtually no risk to the public. Not only does Mr. Santos already enjoy an existing support network from his family and in the wider community, but he also has a great future awaiting him in highly productive work. Remarkably, while in prison Mr. Santos has become a serious scholar of the criminal justice system. His extensive writings transcend any ideological criticism of the American criminal justice and or any personal self-justification. Rather, he has read and written widely about contemporary policy debates on penal policy. As a result, once released, he will be able to work steadily and productively as a writer and researcher as

Inspire, Innovate, Lead.

well as counselor to other released inmates. In that regard, as noted in more detail below, we have already told Mr. Santos that we look forward to an association between him and our Stanford Criminal Justice Center.

One of us (Professor Weisberg) has more recently become familiar with Mr. Santos, specifically through reading his recent essays on criminal justice. Both of us have recently contributed chapters to the newly published Oxford Handbook of Sentencing and Corrections (Prof. Petersilia is co-editor as well). Colleagues throughout the country have been receiving commentaries from Mr. Santos, as he has been reviewing each chapter and posting them online through his wife. We are flattered by these writings, because they are respectful and thoughtful reviews of our own work, and they spurred us to read his commentaries on other chapters as well.

Mr. Santos's essays on the various book chapters are dazzling in their analytic precision and elegance of writing. Stanford is one of the three highest-ranked law schools in the nation, with brilliant students drawn from Ivy League and other elite colleges. Yet if we had assigned our students to write commentaries on the chapters in this very demanding academic treatise, we would have given an "A" grade to any student who produced papers on the level of Mr. Santos's work. One of the striking features of his essays is that he weaves personal experience into his intellectual analysis, and yet he never does so in ways that portray himself as the victim of injustice. Rather, he takes advantage of his personal perspective in offering general insights about penal policy and feasible programs for reform. Thus, in one essay, on the need for better reentry programs, he notes that rigid prison rules denied him the right to visitation by California State University professor who was serving as his mentor. Clearly Mr. Santos knew he had other ways of receiving help from his mentor, and other intellectual resources as well, but he used this incident simply as an objective example of the inefficacy of some prison rules for other, less fortunate inmates. Similarly, in his essay on education programs in the prisons, he argues that more investment in education would better serve the long-term goals of public safety and successful reentry. Mr. Santos did not have as much access to formal education as he might have liked, but he recognizes in this essay that he himself did not suffer significant deprivation in this regard, because his self-directed education had already advanced him to such a high-level. (Indeed, he was reading Plato and Aristotle early in his prison years!) Instead, once again Mr. Santos used his personal observations of prison policy to illustrate the need for reforms to help those less able to self-educate. Another example concerns women prisoners. Obviously Mr. Santos has had no direct opportunity for observation of the conditions of women prisoners, but he has read much on the subject and he goes on to recognize the unique deprivations that female inmates face and to call for reforms in women's prisons. Thus, one of the key features of Mr.

Santos's writing is that he has a capacity for empathy that in turn enables him to write with thoughtful objectivity.

Finally, let us say something about Mr. Santos's post-prison future. On the basis of the work he has already done, we regard Mr. Santos as a writer and very eminent policy analyst in the field of sentencing and corrections. We also welcome his great wisdom about the most needed and feasible improvements in reentry practice and programs. We therefore hope to have him work with us in a number of roles, including teaching guest classes in our course at Stanford Law School and serving as a research collaborator on key projects with both faculty and students. Here at the Stanford Criminal Justice Center, we are selective about who we collaborate with or to whom we offer any formal institutional association. We have politely declined requests from many full-time professors who seek a partnership with us, because their work, however worthy, is not relevant enough to our academic goals. So Mr. Santos has passed quite a difficult screen in garnering this invitation from us. We anxiously await his release so that we can involve him in many activities at Stanford Law School and beyond.

We hope this letter provides a helpful enhancement to Mr. Santos's very strong application for parole release. If you require any additional information, please do not hesitate to call upon us. We have absolutely no hesitation in recommending Mr. Santos for release — in fact, his release is long overdue.

On a break from his desk job in Petaluma, Michael Santos climbs into his Chevy compact and drives to a quiet hillside estate, hands on the wheel at 10 and 2.

His wife, Carole, is living in a newly furnished guesthouse and is at the door as he parks and announces, "Honey, I'm home."

They both laugh because this is her home, not his. His home is in a halfway house in San Francisco, where he is finishing a 45-year sentence for drug trafficking. With credit for good behavior, he spent 25 years and two days, more than half his life, locked up. In that time, he published seven books on incarceration, ranging from the macro, "Inside: Life



Behind Bars in America," to the micro, "Pris My 8,344th Day," and married Carole Goodwin, whom he's known since grade school.

Santos, 48, was released to community confinement in August, but he is still federal prisoner No. 16377004. There are institutional rules. Plus there are his rules that are strict id unbendable. "If I'm not exercising the same level of discipline that guided me through prison," he says, pondering the pull of recidivism, "I know the statistics."

So after a few minutes admiring the contents of a refrigerator, and a quick hand-holding session with his wife, he is back in the car, hands on the wheel at 10 and 2.

"The entire journey for me has been hyper-deliberate," he says, speaking softly and slowly. "It has all been in preparation for this period of time when I can emerge into society with opportunities to live as a contributing person. Nothing distracts me from what I need to do."

Santos is employed by Golden State Lumber, because its owner, Lee Nobmann, met him in Lompoc, where Nobmann was serving a 13-month sentence for tax evasion. On his way out, Nobmann promised Santos a place to live and a paying job, which has nothing to do with the business of lumber.

"My job is to continue doing what I was doing in prison," he says. "To help the people understand the American prison system, the strategies that I've used to get through it."

He has a website, www.michaelsantos.net, which gets thousands of unique visitors a day, and 1,124 daily followers on Facebook. Every day a hundred new inmates are writing to him in desperate need of his help.

'Messiah' to other prisoners

"For people who are lacking in hope he has become a messiah," says Joan Petersilia, a ofessor at Stanford Law School and scholar in prison re-entry. "There is a dearth of hope in prison, and Michael is trying to give it to them. Through his books he's created this movement, this kind of, 'You can do it, too.' "

His most widely distributed book, "Inside," published in 2006 by St. Martin's Press, is in its seventh printing. In it, Santos describes how he got by as just about the only inmate who was not either armed with a deadly weapon at all times and/or affiliated with a gang, or paying for protection against sexual predators and sadists.

In the federal prison system, prisoners move from place to place and state to state. Santos has lived in 19 of them, and at every new stop a new prisoner is tested for weakness. Santos' first stop was at a high-security penitentiary in Atlanta that, at the time, was the most violent prison in America.

"My strategy was to minimize my contact with the prison population to avoid violence," says Santos, and it helped that he didn't snitch against his partners in crime.


Inmates are locked down for half the day, and released into the compound for the other half. So at 6 a.m., when the doors unlocked, he'd spring to the track for a 10-mile run. Then he'd go straight to work in a prison office, where he'd stay until 5 p.m., when he would go to class until 8 p.m., when he would go to the prison hospital and volunteer.

Lockdown is at 9 p.m., but Santos got two extra hours by volunteering for suicide watch in the hospital. So the cellblock was quiet at 11 p.m. when he finally returned to his cell for ed. He never ate or watched television with the prison population.

Road to drug trafficking

The son of a Cuban immigrant father and a mother of Spanish descent, Santos grew up in a fivebedroom house on 5 acres in Lake Forest Park, a Seattle suburb. In high school he played football and was a skier.

"We were a clean-cut athletic family," says his older sister, Julie Santos, a year ahead of Michael in school. "Nothing about our upbringing would lead us to deal drugs."

After graduation, Santos worked for his father's firm, installing street lighting, and helped



grow the company, largely through bid riggir—nd collusion. That gave him a taste for lucre, and he began using company funds to mance cocaine distribution. He made \$100,000 in a day, but he wanted millions, so he moved to Miami to work directly with suppliers.

e says he was never part of the drug culture. Then, as now, he was an enterprising businessman, living in Miami and driving a Porsche with a diamond-faced Rolex on one arm and a South American wife in tight designer clothes on the other. "I was being influenced by movies like 'Scarface' and 'Miami Vice,' " he says.

Santos was 23 when the Drug Enforcement Administration caught up with him in 1987. He was charged with operating a continuing criminal enterprise.

This was during the Reagan-era war on drugs, and examples had to be made. His partners testified against him. The jury returned a guilty verdict on all counts.

As Santos awaited sentencing, he picked up a copy of "Treasury of Philosophy" and started learning about Socrates.

"It was this commitment he had toward serving his term with dignity and honor, and I decided that's what I have to do," Santos recalls telling the judge. "I have to find a way to reconcile with society."

As soon as he got to the penitentiary, his wife divorced him. His father lost his business. His parents moved to Miami to be near him, only to have their marriage collapse.

Stuck to education goals

Amid all this turmoil and danger, Santos stuck to his goals.

"One was to educate myself," he says. "One was to find a way to contribute to society. The `ird one was to start building a support network of law-abiding citizens who could _ientor me."

He got his bachelor's degree from Mercer University in Atlanta, majoring in human resources management. The graduation ceremony was deep inside the penitentiary, and Julie Santos recalls that her brother was the only graduate to wear a cap and gown.

Santos then got his master's, and he was working toward his doctorate when a warden put a stop to it, he says, by dropping his access to library books sent by the university.

No warden could stop him from writing, though he says some tried, through disciplinary actions and transfers.

"Part of what makes him unique is his ability to network," says Petersilia, the Stanford professor who responded to a letter that Santos sent her and ended up writing to the prison parole board on his behalf. "His reach within the prison to the outside world is unprecedented."

But he was unable to get outside to attend the funeral of his father, who died eight years ago. His mother, Geri Fierra, living in Southern California, "has been emotionally devoted to Michael the entire journey," Julie says.


Missed reunion leads to wife

When the 20th reunion of Shorecrest High School, class of 1982, rolled around, Santos was in a low-security institution at Fort Dix, N.J., and unable to attend. But Carole 'oodwin, who organized the event and had known him since fifth grade, tracked him own through his website.







son and daughter, ages 11 and 13.

She'd left Oregon as a homemaker and arrived in New Jersey as a publisher, "helping me bring my books to market," says Santos, who had been compiling the stories of prisoners for whom he did legal research.

In 10 years, she has now moved 22 times, pulling her kids from one school and putting them in another. She's also cobbled together a nursing degree, and is working as an RN in Sonoma and starts graduate school at USF in January.

Meanwhile, Santos has published more than 1 million words, and made between \$300,000 and \$400,000 in royalties and fees. His next book, "Earning Freedom: Conquering a 45-Year Prison Term," is awaiting the last chapter, which began Aug. 13.

That's the day he walked out the door after 9,135 days in federal custody. Carole was waiting with a pizza from a local restaurant.

"I'll never forget the minute that we crossed over from the prison boundaries into the civilian world," says Carole. "It was ... I'm going to cry."

Re-entry to world

Santos went from 10 minutes a day on a prison pay phone to having an iPhone in his hands. He'd never seen one before. He hadn't touched a steering wheel since 1987 or eaten with a metal fork or taken a shower without shower shoes.

The reunion with his wife, while short, amounted to the most time Santos and his wife of 10 years have spent together. "I have to report to a halfway house in three hours," he says, "so I don't have time to stop for anything. I also know that I could take that chance, but I can't afford to do anything to screw that up."

When he is in his room, he is either sleeping or running in place and dropping to do pushups. Otherwise he is happy to chat between 7:30 p.m., when he gets home, and 8:15, when he goes to bed, in order to be up at 3 a.m. answering e-mails before he leaves for work at 6, six days a week.

If he follows all the rules, in February he will transition to home confinement at the pool house in Petaluma, before transitioning to several years of probation. There are more books in him. "Three a year" is the quota he's set.

Petersilia has invited him to lecture her law school class at Stanford, and he's been invited to lecture out of state. But he's not allowed to leave California for a year. That's how he was regrettably unable to attend the 30th reunion of Shorecrest High, just like the 20th. It came and went in August, and Carole didn't make it, either.

"She was picking me up from prison that week," he says with a laugh. "Maybe we'll hit the 50-year reunion."



Board Qualifications:

Ordinance No. 44-11 designated one of the members of the Board of Supervisors to serve as a member of the Council and changed the qualifications of the 4 Board of Supervisors' appointees.

Ordinance No. 26-09 added a fourth seat that the Board of Supervisors can appoint and to exempt all members of the Reentry Council from the requirement that they be electors of the City and County.

The Reentry Council is created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco County Jail, San Francisco Juvenile Justice System out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population. The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law. The council shall consist of 23 members, seven of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as a member, and shall also appoint three of the members.

The Board of Supervisors shall designate one of its members to serve as a member of the Council, and shall appoint the four of the seven members who are former inmates. Of these four members, at least one shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system, at least one must have been released from custody within two years of his or her appointment at least one must have served multiple terms of incarceration. All members of the Council shall be exempt from the Charter requirement that they be electors of the City and County of San Francisco.

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency, the Department of Children, Youth and Families and the Department of Public Health.

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court; Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations; and the United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one member each to the Council. If any of these four agencies does not appoint a representative, the Council co-chairs shall appoint an additional member.

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any Council member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned. Eleven members of the Council shall constitute a quorum and the Council shall have the authority to act on the vote of the majority of the quorum.

The four members appointed by the Adult Probation Department, District Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office and the Sheriff's Department, respectively, as well as the Mayor or the Mayor's representative, shall co-chair the Council.

The Council may establish subcommittees. The Council shall meet in full at least three times per year.

Reports: At least once a year, the Council shall prepare and submit a report that shall include but not be limited to information identifying funding streams; programs serving individuals exiting the criminal justice system; needs of reentry population; and barriers to safe and successful reentry. City departments shall respond within 30 days, if mentioned in report. Reports shall be provided to the Mayor; Board of Supervisors; City departments in report and the public.

The Council shall be staffed, subject to fiscal and budgetary provisions of the Charter, by the Public Defender's Office, District Attorney's and the Mayor's Office designating one staff member each.

Sunset: June 1, 2014, unless the Board of Supervisors adopts an ordinance continuing its
