WHEREAS, This initiative would prohibit inclusionary housing measures, which, in addition to rent control protections, are one of our City's most important tools for providing affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, This initiative would severely restrict the Public Utilities Commission's \$4.2 billion Water System Improvement Program, which is critical to maintaining water delivery for 2.5 million Bay Area residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, A legal analysis conducted by the League of California Cities shows that this initiative could impair or stop basic zoning regulations, California's global warming legislation, California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) mitigations, and "smart growth" regulations; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors declares that the "California Property Owners and Farmland Protection Act" will eliminate rent control protections and severely exacerbate the affordable housing crisis in San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds that the "California Property Owners and Farmland Protection Act" will undermine the City's efforts to rebuild its water delivery system; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors determines that the "California Property Owners and Farmland Protection Act" would seriously restrict the City's ability to fight global warming and enforce sensible land use policies; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors strongly opposes the "California Property Owners and Farmland Protection Act."
