Dear Supervisor Tang,

On behalf of the Junior League San Francisco Board of Directors, I am writing to inform you on January 5, 2015, of our unanimous vote to support your Resolution, File 141314, -- recognizing the calendar month of January as National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, and the calendar day of January 11 as National Human Trafficking Awareness Day in the City and County of San Francisco, and supporting the campaign to bring awareness to the issue of human trafficking."

We agree that human trafficking is a serious issue that impacts victims, their families, and communities across our county. This is an intricate and complex issue, because of the power and control exerted over the victim has sexual, physical, emotional and/or psychological consequences.

Recently, San Francisco has been identified by the FBI as being one of the top three hubs for human trafficking in the nation. There has been an increase in local efforts to raise public awareness and provide services to the victims in our community. We understand SFPD Special Victims Unit has established an advocacy program to help specifically with human trafficking victims which we hope continues to succeed.

Historically, The Junior League of San Francisco has taken position statements on issues relevant to the League's work in the community. On January 5, 2015 we established an official position taking a stand against human trafficking.
