8	WHEREAS, On September 14,2004 Attorneys General from New York, Illinois, New
9	Mexico Wisconsin and the US Virgin Islands along with community and environmental
10	leaders joined together to file suit again HUD over pesticide use in public housing; and,
	WHEREAS, The lawsuit seeks to reduce pesticide exposure of families who live in
11	public housing and asks the courts to direct HUD to promote and use of "Integrated Pest
12	Management"(IPM), a more effective method of pest control that prevents pest problems by
13	improving sanitary and structural conditions in the housing stock and the use of mechanical,
14	physical and biological controls; and,
15	WHEREAS, On Oct 8 th , 2003, state Attorneys General petitioned HUD to require HUD-
16	funded public housing developments to adopt and implement IMP; and,
17	WHEREAS, On December 2003, HUD denied the request but did not dispute the
18	accuracy of the evidence presented in the petition; and,
19	WHEREAS, San Francisco has one of the highest asthma hospitalization rates for
20	children and adults in California; and,
21	WHEREAS, The rate of asthma hospitalizations for 13 out of 21 zip code areas in San
2223	Francisco exceed the Health People 2000 objective - the highest hospitalization rates are in

Bayview Hunters Point, Visitacion Valley, Western Addition, South of Market, China Basin

and the Tenderloin where many of these families live in public housing developments; and,

1	WHEREAS, Pesticides are poisons that can damage people's lives and can pose a
2	grave danger to infants' health and children living with Asthma; now, therefore be it
3	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urge the California Attorne
4	General Bill Lockyer to join New York, Illinois, New Mexico, Wisconsin and the US Virgin
5	Islands in a lawsuit against HUD over pesticide use in public housing.
