URGING GOVERNOR GRAY DAVIS, AS WELL AS THE CALIFORNIA SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, TO SUPPORT ASSEMBLY BILL 241 AUTHORED BY DION ARONER WHICH PROHIBITS THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES FROM APPROVING THE DOWNGRADE OR CLOSURE OF AN URBAN HOSPITAL'S EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT IF THE COUNTY'S LOCAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AGENCY DEEMS THE CLOSURE OR DOWNSIZING TO BE DETRIMENTAL TO HEALTH, SAFETY AND OVERALL INTEREST OF THE COMMUNITY.

WHEREAS, California has lost 19 emergency rooms since 1997 with Los Angeles County losing 20% of its emergency wards and Alameda County losing 35% of its hospitals and emergency beds; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco's Mount Zion Hospital, with a tradition over a century of treating minority, indigent and marginalized populations, had to close its emergency ward at the end of 1999 for fiscal reasons; and

WHEREAS, Emergency departments of hospitals have become the primary source of routine care for millions of poor, indigent and uninsured citizens; and

WHEREAS, The inability to pay and the lack of access to transportation often force the poor to seek medical care at when illness or disease has progressed to point where the patient can no longer properly function, and

WHEREAS, Cuts in federal and state medical reimbursements as well as the low amount of reimbursement paid out by private managed care companies have impelled many hospitals to close and downgrade its emergency wards; and

WHEREAS, Emergency ward closures forces other existing hospitals to go on diversion, thus creating overcrowding, long waiting lines, chronically overworked staff, low staff morale and increasing the number of preventable deaths; and

WHEREAS; The number of deaths of people waiting to be treated in emergency rooms are steadily increasing; and

WHEREAS; The increasing closures and downsizing of emergency wards will greatly imperil the safety and health of the citizens of San Francisco during a major disaster; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 421, authored by Assemblywoman Dion Aroner would prohibit the State Department of Health Services (DHS) from approving a closure or downgrade of an emergency ward if the County's Local Emergency Medical Services Agency (LEMSA) deem that such a closure or downsizing would be detrimental to the health and safety of the community; and

WHEREAS; However, AB241 would exempt hospitals located in rural areas as well as those hospitals in which the DHS finds that the prohibition of closure or downsizing might imperil its financial stability; and

WHEREAS; AB241 would also allow hospitals to appeal any decision rendered by DHS; and

WHEREAS, It is in the interests of the City and County of San Francisco to maintain and preserve the number of available emergency wards in order to safegaurd the health and safety of its citizens; now, therefore, be it
