3 **Resolution adding the name "Enid Ng Lim Alley" to Bartol Street in recognition of Enid**
4 **Ng Lim and her many contributions to San Francisco.**

6 WHEREAS, Enid Ng Lim championed equality, justice and opportunity throughout her
7 life; and

8 WHEREAS, Enid, a native San Franciscan, utilized her education, life experiences,
9 great spirit, and determination to connect Chinatown's interests with those of greater San
10 Francisco; and

11 WHEREAS, Enid was appointed by Mayor Willie L. Brown, Jr. as one of the original
12 members of the Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors in 2000 and served as
13 the inaugural Vice President of the Board from 2000 - 2003, where she utilized her
14 perspective as a regular Muni rider to provide leadership on improving paratransit,
15 accessibility, service quality and training for Muni operators and staff; and

16 WHEREAS, Enid was a member of San Francisco Tomorrow, and was instrumental in
17 expanding transit in under-served areas of the City through tireless advocacy of route design
18 and scheduling; and

19 WHEREAS, Enid served for many years with Chinatown TRIP, an organization which
20 brought attention to Chinatown's mobility and transit concerns, and she is regarded as the
21 "Mother" of the Central Subway that will link the Third Street Light Rail with Chinatown, a vital
22 project that her early vision and advocacy enabled to be environmentally approved and fast-
23 tracked for federal funding; and

24 WHEREAS, Enid worked for many years in the Chinatown community with the
25 Chinatown Resource Center on historical issues and preservation of historic sites, the

1 Presbyterian Church's Cameron House on their youth programs, and San Francisco City Hall
2 as a Docent; and

3 WHEREAS, Enid served on the staff of the Chinatown Community Development
4 Center and was a member of the Chinatown Alleyway Improvement Association, which both
5 continually advocated for Bartol Alley improvements; and

6 WHEREAS, Enid's work aided in keeping 1000 Montgomery, a single room occupancy
7 hotel that had opened in 1989, a place for affordable senior housing, which On Lok
8 Community Housing now manages; and

9 WHEREAS, Enid spent her last days at On Lok at Bartol Alley; now, therefore, be it
10 RESOLVED, There shall be an honorary naming of "Enid Ng Lim Alley" in recognition
11 of her valued contributions to the City of San Francisco and the community of Chinatown; and,
12 be it

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Municipal
14 Transportation Agency to erect street signs indicating both the honorary and the existing
15 names of the street, either on a single sign or on separate signs, with the honorary name
16 "Enid Ng Lim Alley" in smaller letters, and the existing name "Bartol Street" in larger letters
17 above or beneath the honorary name; and, be it

18 FURTHER RESOLVED, That both of the street names, "Enid Ng Lim Alley" and "Bartol
19 Street," shall remain posted permanently; and, be it

20 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works is directed to add the
21 honorary street name to its official list of Commemorative Street Names in accordance with
22 Public Works Code 789 et seq.

I am writing to express Mayor Lee's support for the resolutions renaming three streets in Chinatown after Donaldina Cameron, Harold 'Bud' Moose and Enid Ng Lim for their many contributions to the Chinatown neighborhood and the City of San Francisco.

Donaldina Cameron devoted her life to helping immigrant Asian women who were vulnerable upon their arrival to the United States. In 1874, she created a foundation to help Asian women who were victims of discrimination and violence. That organization has since grown into a multi-service agency which serves Chinatown's low income residents.

Harold 'Bud' Moose was a commercial real estate developer whose proudest achievement was the development of a 27-story hotel and Chinese Cultural Center. The cultural center, which was established in 1973, provides a space for art, education, and community engagement.

Enid Ng Lim fought tirelessly for the improvement of transportation in our city. Her advocacy for the most under-served areas in our city led to the creation of new bus routes and improved paratransit accessibility.

These three San Franciscans contributed to the success of our City and are well deserving of these honors. Mayor Lee urges the Board of Supervisors to approve these resolutions.

Enid served as the second staff in TRIP's 36 year history. In that capacity, she was instrumental in inspiring and encouraging our participation and involvement in pedestrian safety issues back in the 1970's and 1980's. She was a tireless worker on the project to install the "scramble lights" along Stockton Street that has helped tremendously to reduce jay-walking and pedestrian accidents on one of the city's most congested pedestrian thoroughfares. She was a true pioneer and inspired people to become successful and prominent in whatever field they chose, having been an extraordinary role model herself. Dear Supervisors - David, Jane & Scott:

Although I will not be in town for the long awaited renaming of the three Chinatown/North Beach Alleys, I wanted to write you this email letter of support for the proposed alleys: Old Chinatown Lane to its former name honoring "Donaldina CAMERON" alley; Bartol alley to "ENID NG LIM" alley and Merchant alley next to the Hilton for BUD MOOSE (Geoff's mentor).

I personally met Ms. Cameron in my late teen years at Cameron House where I have worked at as a pastor & youth director... and last year, a new book on her life was written acknowledging her courageous work in old Chinatown when many girls were sold into indentured servant hood, prostitution... She helped to create one of the first Asian Women's Shelter in the country at Cameron House.

Regarding, Cameron Alley, (Old Chinatown Lane), The board and staff asked me if the alleyway could be renamed from old Chinatown lane to acknowledge the work of Ms. Cameron and Cameron House in time for their February 8, 2014 celebration of 140 years of service to the community.

Regarding Enid -- I knew and loved her very much as my co-worker. I knew Enid Lim at Cameron House, the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown and as my colleague working at Chinatown CDC. She really was like the "mom" in our young team of organizers & planners at CCDC back in the '90s. Her wisdom and ability to relate to so many people city wide astounded us young activist back then. She knew everyone -- from Nob Hill to City Hall folks to everyone in Chinatown.

In the 1990s, I got to co-emcee the Chinese New Year Parade with her every year... and as I still emcee the review stand, I always think of her.

She pulled together many collaborations working on "clean streets & alleyways" to "historic preservation". She led both Chinatown TRIP and the Chinatown Environmental Control Task Force...

She has unselfishly worked for the community's & San Francisco's interest for so many decades... This renaming is so "right" for her.

After Enid passed away, we at CCDC have always hoped for an opportunity to honor her legacy and it is quite appropriate that we honor her at Bartol alley for a number of reasons: She helped to save 1000 Montgomery for the Community and afterwards - On Lok located there where she lived during her last year of life. On top of that, she was part of CCDC when we worked to renovate that particular Alley.

Although I did not know Harold Bud Moose, I know Geoff Palermo who owns the Hilton and Geoff has been so generous to the Chinatown Community. He is very community minded and is now working well with the Chinese Cultural Center whose executive director Mabel Teng recently told me -- is also endorsing the renaming of Merchant Alley.

Thank you President Chiu for paving the way through these renaming resolutions to honor these heroes.

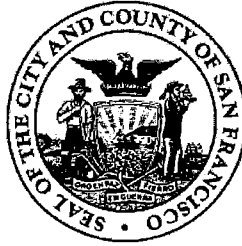


