1 [Celebrating the 155th Anniversary of the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living]

3 **Resolution celebrating the 155th anniversary of the San Francisco Campus for Jewish**
4 **Living and commending its record of compassionate care for older adults and its**
5 **contributions to the City and County of San Francisco.**

7 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living, one of the oldest senior
8 healthcare institutions in the Bay Area, traces its founding to 1871, when it was incorporated
9 as the Pacific Hebrew Orphan Asylum and Home Society to establish and support a home for
10 aged and infirm members of San Francisco's Jewish community; and

11 WHEREAS, Formerly known as "The Jewish Home," the organization opened its doors
12 to residents in the Excelsior in 1891 and, in 1923, opened a new Georgian Revival building
13 designed by San Francisco architect Samuel Lightner Hyman; and

14 WHEREAS, Over the following century, the campus expanded repeatedly, adding new
15 wings in 1945 and 1959, a 176-bed skilled nursing building in 1969, and the 82-bed Koret
16 Center in 1984; and

17 WHEREAS, Today the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living comprises the Jewish
18 Home and Rehabilitation Center, with capacity for 375 patients and residents, and the 190-
19 unit Lynne & Roy M. Frank Residences; and

20 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living provides long-term skilled
21 nursing, short-term rehabilitation, and acute geriatric psychiatric care through the Jewish
22 Home and Rehabilitation Center, and assisted living and memory care through the Frank
23 Residences; and

1 WHEREAS, The Jewish Home and Rehabilitation Center's 12-bed Acute Geriatric
2 Psychiatry Hospital is one of only a small number of specialized inpatient geriatric psychiatric
3 units in Northern California; and

4 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living employs several hundred
5 clinical and allied health professionals and is regarded as one of the largest nonprofit
6 employers in the Excelsior; and

7 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living trains the region's future
8 geriatric care workforce, hosting geriatric psychiatry fellows through partnerships with the
9 University of California, San Francisco Department of Psychiatry and California Pacific
10 Medical Center, and nursing students from San Francisco State University, the University of
11 San Francisco, and Dominican University of California; and

12 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living's Memory Care Experience
13 Station, a multisensory therapy developed for residents with dementia, was named a finalist in
14 Fast Company's World Changing Ideas Awards and LeadingAge California's Innovation
15 Showcase, and received an honorable mention from the SCAN Foundation's Innovation
16 Award; and

17 WHEREAS, In 2024, the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living absorbed more than
18 \$2.2 million in unreimbursed costs providing care to Medi-Cal patients and joined the San
19 Francisco Department of Public Health and other city partners in developing the San
20 Francisco Health Improvement Partnership's Community Health Needs Assessment; and

21 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living serves more than 2,500
22 individuals and families each year and will mark its 155th anniversary with a Campus-wide
23 Celebration on July 29, 2026, honoring a century and a half of service to older adults across
24 San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
2 does hereby congratulate the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living on the occasion of its
3 155th anniversary and commends its longstanding commitment to compassionate care for
4 older adults; and, be it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
6 Francisco recognizes the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living's contributions to the
7 Excelsior neighborhood and to the City as a whole and wishes the organization continued
8 success in its mission for generations to come; and, be it

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board shall send a copy of this
10 Resolution to the San Francisco Campus for Jewish Living.
