WHEREAS, There have been 874 non-negligent homicides in San Francisco between 1990 through 1999, including 70 murders in 1998 alone and 28 from January through June of 1999, and

WHEREAS. Though survivors may individually and formally "remember them" on their own anniversary dates or on other special occasions, a special public day of remembrance is vitally necessary healing and therapeutic process for grieving family members and friends, and

WHEREAS; Given the heightened media and public scrutiny during the recent tragedy in Littleton, Colorado, Jonesboro, Arkansas, and the Oklahoma bombing, it is even more important to establish a public day of commemoration for family members and raise awareness amongst the general public; and

WHEREAS, A public day of remembrance for murder victims will not only provide comfort to all survivors of homicide victims and but also an opportunity to educate the general public about the plight of family members from the initial emotional trauma and their legal efforts to obtain justice and strategies to improve and reinforce community safety; and

WHEREAS, The Golden Gate Chapter of Parents of Murdered Children (POMC) is a self help organization which provides needed support services for the families and friends of homicide victims in which survivors can find comfort with other survivors; and

WHEREAS, The 100,000 member POMC with 300 chapters nationally is calling for a national day of remembrance of those who have died by intentional violence; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby proclaim September 25, 1999 as San Francisco Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors offer heartfelt condolences to family members and friends of those who have passed away through intentional violence.
