13	Section 1. Board o	of Supervisors Resolution No. 59-10 is hereby amended, to read as		
14	follows:			
15	WHEREAS, The C	ity and County of San Francisco (the "City") recognizes that it is vita		
16	for local, regional, state, and federal agencies to stimulate the economy; create and retain			
17	jobs; reduce fossil fuel em	nissions; reduce total energy usage; and improve energy efficiency;		
18	and			
19	WHEREAS, The C	ity has committed to an ongoing, coordinated effort to reduce the		
20	emissions that cause global warming, improve air quality, reduce waste, reduce energy use			
21	and save money; and			
2223	WHEREAS, The City is committed to reducing these community-wide greenhouse gas			
23 24	emissions by 20% below its1990 levels by 2012; and

1	WHEREAS, In 2004, San Francisco's Department of the Environment ("SFE") and
2	Public Utilities Commission ("SFPUC") released a "Climate Action Plan for San Francisco"
3	identifying transportation, energy efficiency, renewable energy, and solid waste measures that
4	could achieve significant greenhouse gas reductions; and
5	WHEREAS, The Climate Action Plan called for implementing energy efficiency
6	programs and projects throughout the City; and
7	WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors further finds and declares that growing
8	population, climate change, and the need to protect and grow the City's economy while
9	protecting and restoring fish and wildlife habitats makes it essential that the City and County
10	manage its water resources as efficiently as possible; and
11	WHEREAS, Reduced water use through conservation provides significant energy and
12	environmental benefits, and can help protect water quality, improve streamflows, and reduce
13	greenhouse gas emissions; and
14	WHEREAS, The California Energy Commission's ("CEC") State Energy Program (the
15	"State Energy Program") will provide funds to eligible local governments to assist in the
16	development of financing programs to stimulate the implementation cost-effective renewable
17	energy, energy efficiency and water efficiency projects based on a competitive selection
18	process; and
19	WHEREAS, The State Energy Program has been funded as part of the American
20	Recovery and Reinvestment Act; and
21	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is eligible for funding under the
22	State Energy Program; and
23	WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors has adopted legislation necessary to form an
24	opt-in Mello-Roos special tax district and to establish legal mechanisms and policies to govern

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1	the implementation of a municipal financing program for retrofits of privately-owned buildings,
2	known as GreenFinanceSF; and
3	WHEREAS, SFPUC staff, working in conjunction with SFE and the Controller's Office
4	of Public Finance, submitted an application for State Energy Program financial assistance on
5	behalf of the City and GreenFinanceSF; and
6	WHEREAS, On February 10, 2010, the CEC announced the awards under the State
7	Energy Program, which included an award of up to \$2,080,000 for GreenFinanceSF; and
8	WHEREAS, In its Resolution No. 008-10, this Board of Supervisors identified SFE as
9	the administrator of the GreenFinanceSF program on behalf of the City; and
10	WHEREAS, SFE will collaborate with SFPUC and the Controller's Office of Public
11	Finance to ensure the successful implementation of the GreenFinanceSF program in general
12	and the expenditure of State Energy Program funds in particular; and
13	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has considered the application of
14	the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to the implementation of the proposed
15	GreenFinanceSF program and the utilization of the State Energy Program grant; and
16	WHEREAS, As described in the GreenFinanceSF application, the program will assist
17	in the financing of energy- and water-saving retrofits of existing structures in conformance with
18	existing building codes; provide incentive payments for qualifying retrofit projects; and monitor
19	and evaluate environmental performance of projects; and
20	WHEREAS, All projects undertaken with this funding are in compliance with the
21	California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), California Public Resources Code Section
22	21000; and
23	WHEREAS, The term of the State Energy Program grant will be from March 15, 2010
24	through March 31, 2012; now, therefore, be it

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1	RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the General Manager of
2	the Public Utilities Commission the Executive Director of SFE to accept a State Energy Program
3	grant award on behalf of the City, and to enter into all necessary contracts and agreements,
4	and amendments thereto, on its behalf to implement and carry out the GreenFinanceSF
5	municipal financing program project as generally described above and as further detailed in
6	the GreenFinanceSF Application; and, be it
7	FURTHER RESOLVED, The General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission Executive
8	Director of SFE is further authorized to furnish whatever additional information or assurances
9	the funding agency may request in connection with this grant, and to execute any and all
10	agreements necessary to carry out the purpose of the grant.
11	
12	Section 2. The authorization granted the General Manager of the Public Utilities
13	Commission to accept and expend the subject grant is granted retroactive to the original
14	adoption of Resolution No. 59-10. The Board of Supervisors ratifies any actions previously
15	taken by the Department of the Environment and the Public Utilities Commission to apply for,
16	accept and expend the subject grant.
