1	[Supporting City of Oakland to fight lawsuit against Plastic Bag Ban]

3	Resolution supporting the City of Oakland in fighting a lawsuit that has been brought
4	against Oakland's recently passed ban on non-compostable check out plastic bags at
5	large retail stores and urging the City of Oakland to fight the industry suit and not to
6	conduct a full environmental impact report that could set a precedent for other local
7	government efforts to protect the environment.
8	
9	WHEREAS, bags use increasingly scarce resources including energy, and create
10	pollution from production through disposal, with only 1% of plastic bags being recycled; and,
11	WHEREAS, plastic bags create significant, persistent and costly litter problems for Bay
12	Area streets, beaches, sewer system and the marine environment; and,
13	WHEREAS, San Francisco and the City of Oakland have both passed landmark
14	legislation to reduce the use of plastic bags by requiring the use of reusable, compostable
15	plastic or recyclable paper bags, for large grocery stores; and,
16	WHEREAS, plastic bags are perceived as disposable products and are an impediment
17	to landfill diversion and waste reduction; and,
18	WHEREAS, a plastics industry front group calling itself "The Coalition to Support
19	Plastic Bag Recycling" is suing the City of Oakland in an effort to overturn the city's ordinance
20	on the grounds that the city did not comply with the California Environmental Quality Act
21	(CEQA); and,
22	WHEREAS, completion of an unnecessary Environmental Impact Assessment could
23	set a precedent that would interfere with other local government attempts to protect the
24	environment and public health; now, therefore, be it

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the City of Oakland to fight the
2	plastics industry suit and not conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment
