Attached please find a copy of the proposed Resolution for the Board of Supervisors approval, which retroactively authorizes the Office of the District Attorney to accept and expend grants in the amount of \$590,718 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the Unserved/Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program for the purpose of increasing access to culturally appropriate victim services for unserved/underserved victims/survivors of crime for the grant period January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2026.

The "retroactive" request is administrative in nature. The Department has met the City's requirement to appropriate grant funding prior to beginning any grant activities. The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services Unserved/Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach grant is a recurring grant with a start date of January 1st. This recurring grant was included in the annual department budget submission. The City and County of San Francisco's FY 2023-24 and FY 2024-2025 Budget and Appropriation Ordinance includes this recurring grant; however, that does not meet the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services resolution requirements, thus, a separate resolution is necessary.
