3 Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish the Cannabis Oversight
4 Committee to advise the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor regarding the
5 implementation and enforcement of City laws and regulations relating to cannabis; and
6 to require the Director of the Office of Cannabis to report information to the Committee
7 regarding the growth of the cannabis industry in the City.

13 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

15 Section 1. Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Article
16 X, consisting of Sections 5.10-1 through 5.10-8, to read as follows:

18 ARTICLE X:

19 CANNABIS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

20
21 SEC. 5.10-1. CREATION OF COMMITTEE.

22 The Board of Supervisors ("Board") hereby establishes the Cannabis Oversight Committee
23 ("Committee").

24
25 SEC. 5.10-2. DEFINITIONS.

1 Terms not defined in this Article X shall have the meaning attributed to them in Police Code
2 Section 1602.

3
4 **SEC. 5.10-3. PURPOSE.**

5 In 2018, the City enacted Police Code Article 16 to comprehensively regulate Commercial
6 Cannabis activities, including the implementation of an Equity Program to promote equitable
7 ownership and employment opportunities in the Cannabis industry by lowering barriers for those hit
8 hardest by the War on Drugs. The purpose of the Committee is to 1) convene representatives of
9 Cannabis Business operators, workers, patients, and other key stakeholders in the Cannabis industry to
10 oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation of Police Code Article 16 by evaluating data on the
11 industry's growth; and 2) provide guidance and recommendations to the Board on amendments to local
12 laws and regulations, including those governing the Equity Program, to facilitate socially responsible
13 growth of this new industry by creating living wage jobs and economic opportunities consistent with the
14 Board's intent in adopting Police Code Article 16.

15
16 **SEC. 5.10-4. MEMBERSHIP.**

17 The Committee shall consist of nine voting members and ~~five~~seven non-voting members, as
18 follows (seats 1 through ~~5~~7 being non-voting members):

19 (a) Seat 1 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Public Health or the Director's
20 designee.

21 (b) Seat 2 shall be held by the Chief of the Police Department or the Chief's designee.

22 (c) Seat 3 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Building Inspection or the
23 Director's designee.

24 (d) Seat 4 shall be held by the Director of the Planning Department or the Director's designee.
25

1 (e) Seat 5 shall be held by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District or
2 the Superintendent's designee, which may include a Member of the Board of Education. The
3 Superintendent is not required to hold this seat or appoint a designee, but shall be invited to do so.

4 (f) Seat 6 shall be held by a member the Executive Director of the Entertainment
5 Commission or the Executive Director's designee, appointed by the Entertainment
6 Commission.

7 (g) Seat 7 shall be held by the Chief of the Fire Department or the Chief's designee.

8 (h) Seat 68 shall be held by an Owner of a Cannabis Business permitted through the Equity
9 Program, appointed by the Board. If there are no Equity Applicant permit-holders who apply for
10 the seat, then the Board may appoint a person who, at the time of the appointment, is an
11 Equity Applicant, as that term is defined in Police Code Subsection 1604(b).

12 (i) Seat 79 shall be held by the operator of a Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, or
13 distribution business with fewer than 20 employees at the time of appointment, appointed by the Board.

14 (j) Seat 810 shall be held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis
15 business labor force, appointed by the Board.

16 (k) Seat 911 shall held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis
17 delivery service labor force, appointed by the Board.

18 (l) Seat 120 shall be held by an Owner of a Storefront Cannabis Retailer, appointed by the
19 Board.

20 (m) Seat 134 shall be held by a person who, at the time of the appointment, is an Equity
21 Applicant, as that term is defined in Police Code Subsection 1604(b), appointed by the Board
22 a person who lived for at least five years (between 1971-2009) in San Francisco census tracts
23 where at least 17% of the households had incomes at or below the poverty level, appointed by
24 the Board.

1 (An) Seat 142 shall be held by a person with demonstrated subject matter expertise on the State
2 of California's Cannabis laws and regulations, appointed by the Board.

3 (Ao) Seat 153 shall be held by a person with significant experience in workforce and economic
4 development, appointed by the Board.

5 (Ap) Seat 164 shall be held by a person who has been a Medicinal Cannabis patient or
6 Medicinal Cannabis consumer for at least five years, with an extensive history advocating for
7 Medicinal Cannabis patients or involvement in implementing and running a Cannabis compassionate
8 use program in compliance with the Compassionate Use Act of 1996, appointed by the Board.

9
10 **SEC. 5.10-5. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.**

11 (a) Voting members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.
12 Any vacancy in Seats 6 8 through 14 16 on the Committee shall be filled by the Board. Voting
13 members may serve multiple terms.

14 (b) Service on the Committee is voluntary and members shall receive no compensation from the
15 City, except that the members in Seats 1 through 4, 6, and 7 may, if City employees, receive their
16 regular City salaries for time spent on the Committee.

17 (c) Any member in Seats 6 8 through 14 16 who misses three regular meetings of the
18 Committee within a six-month period without the express approval of the Committee at or before each
19 missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee 10 days after the third
20 unapproved absence. The Committee shall inform the Clerk of the Board of any such resignation.

21 (d) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the
22 Committee in the performance of its functions. City departments shall respond within 30 days to
23 reasonable requests for information submitted by the Committee set forth in Administrative Code
24 Subsections 2A.420(b)(7)(A)-(J), if available, and any other reasonable requests for
25 information submitted by the Committee relevant to its ability to discharge its powers and duties.

1 provided that the disclosure of such information shall not be required where it would violate Federal or
2 State law.

3 (e) The Office of Cannabis shall prepare and submit to the Committee a report as set forth in
4 Administrative Code Section 2A.24420.

5 (f) The Office of Cannabis City Administrator shall provide administrative and policy
6 support for the Committee.

7
8 **SEC. 5.10-6. POWERS AND DUTIES.**

9 (a) The Committee shall have the power and duty to:

10 (a1) Oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation and enforcement of City laws and
11 regulations relating to Cannabis, by convening stakeholders, gathering data, and advising the Board
12 and the Mayor.

13 (b2) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, regarding the
14 effectiveness of City laws and regulations relating to the Police Code Section 1604 Equity Program in
15 fostering equitable access to participation in the Cannabis industry and providing assistance to
16 communities unfairly burdened by the War on Drugs.

17 (c3) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, on the overall
18 health and stability of the Cannabis industry in San Francisco and make recommendations on possible
19 ways the City can help the industry grow and prosper.

20 (d4) Recommend to the Board modifications to City laws and regulations relating to
21 Cannabis, including recommendations to maximize the creation of living wage jobs and economic
22 opportunities for communities hit hardest by the War on Drugs. Where appropriate, the Committee's
23 recommendations shall include draft legislation or regulations.

1 **(b) As an advisory committee, tThe Committee shall not have authority to hire, fire,**
2 **or evaluate personnel in the Office of Cannabis, and shall not have authority over decisions by**
3 **the Office of Cannabis to issue, deny or modify permits.**

4
5 **SEC. 5.10-7. MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES.**

6 **(a) The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 30 days after the Board has**
7 **appointed at least eight members to the Committee. There shall be at least ten days' notice of the**
8 **inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not**
9 **less than five times per year until the sunset date set forth in Section 5.10-8.**

10 **(b) The Committee shall elect a Chair and officers for such other positions, if any, it chooses to**
11 **create. The Committee may establish bylaws and rules for its organization and procedures.**

12
13 **SEC. 5.10-8. SUNSET DATE.**

14 **Unless the Board by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article X shall expire by**
15 **operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, three years after the effective date of the**
16 **ordinance in Board File No. 180800 enacting this Article. In that event, after the sunset date, the City**
17 **Attorney shall cause this Article X to be removed from the Administrative Code.**

18
19 Section 2. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 2A.240
20 **2A.420** to read as follows:

21
22 **SEC. 2A.420. OFFICE OF CANNABIS.**

23 (a) Establishment. The Mayor shall establish an Office of Cannabis under the direction
24 of the City Administrator to oversee the implementation of laws and regulations governing
25 cannabis in San Francisco. The City Administrator shall appoint a Director of the Office of

1 Cannabis. The Office of Cannabis shall include such officers and employees as are
2 authorized pursuant to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter.

3 (b) Duties and functions.

4 * * * *

5 (7) By no later than six months after the inaugural meeting of the Cannabis
6 Oversight Committee ("Committee") established in Chapter 5, Article X of the Administrative
7 Code January 1, 2020, and biannually thereafter, the Director shall produce and submit to the
8 Cannabis Oversight Committee a report evaluating the growth of the City's cannabis industry. This
9 report shall include, but need not be limited to, the following information, provided that the gathering
10 or the disclosure of such information is not required where it would violate Federal or State law, and
11 further provided that any reports derived from the data do not identify specific individuals:

12 (A) The total number of permits the Office of Cannabis granted in the prior 12
13 months in each permit category listed in Police Code Section 1607.

14 (B) The total revenue, including tax revenue, permitted Cannabis Businesses
15 generated in the prior 12 months.

16 (C) The total costs the City incurred in processing Cannabis Business Permit
17 applications in the prior 12 months.

18 (D) The total costs Cannabis Business Permit applicants incurred in the prior
19 12 months, associated with preparation, submission, and processing of Cannabis Business Permit
20 applications.

21 (E) The average time for Cannabis Business Permit processing in the prior 12
22 months, measured from the date the Office of Cannabis receives an application for a Cannabis
23 Business Permit through the date the Office of Cannabis grants or denies a permit.

1 (F) The total number and length of time in operation of permitted Cannabis
2 Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by each permit
3 category listed in Police Code Section 1607.

4 (G) The total number of employees directly employed by permitted Cannabis
5 Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by job type or
6 classification.

7 (H) The rate of pay and benefits of employees directly employed by permitted
8 Cannabis Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by job type
9 or classification.

10 (I) The total number of individuals in the City whose Cannabis convictions have
11 been expunged in the prior 12 months.

12 (J) If available, the total number of permitted Cannabis Business owners,
13 operators, and employees categorized by race and sex. The Director may request but not require
14 Cannabis Business owners and operators to disclose such information. The Director may not consider
15 such information in making any permit determination.

16
17 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
18 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
19 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
20 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

21
22 Section 4. Scope of the Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of
23 Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections,
24 articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the
25 Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board

1 amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that
2 appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST
(Amended in Board, 10/16/2018)

[Administrative Code - Cannabis Oversight Committee]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish the Cannabis Oversight Committee to advise the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor regarding the implementation and enforcement of City laws and regulations relating to cannabis; and to require the Director of the Office of Cannabis to report information to the Committee regarding the growth of the cannabis industry in the City.

Existing Law

Police Code Article 16 regulates commercial cannabis activities in the City. The Office of Cannabis, under the direction of the City Administrator, oversees the implementation and enforcement of Article 16.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would create a Cannabis Oversight Committee to advise the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor regarding the implementation and enforcement of City laws and regulations relating to cannabis in the City. The proposed ordinance would require the Office of Cannabis to report to the Committee annually on the growth of the City's cannabis industry. The Committee would terminate three years after the effective date of the ordinance unless the Board re-authorizes it in a subsequent ordinance.

The Committee would have 18 members. Seats 1-7 would be for non-voting members, and would be held by the following:

- The Director of the Department of Public Health (or the Director's designee).
- The Chief of the Police Department (or the Chief's designee).
- The Director of the Department of Building Inspection (or the Director's designee).
- The Director of the Planning Department (or the Director's designee).
- The Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District (or the Superintendent's designee).
- The Chief of the Fire Department (or the Chief's designee).
- The Executive Director of the Entertainment Commission (or the Executive Director's designee).

The remaining seats would be for voting members appointed by the Board, and include:

- A Cannabis owner permitted through the Equity Program.
- An operator of a Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, or distribution business with fewer than 20 employees.
- Two organized labor representatives, including one that works in the delivery labor force.
- A storefront cannabis retailer.
- An Equity Applicant.
- A person with subject matter expertise on the State of California's Cannabis laws and regulations.
- A person with significant experience in workforce and economic development.
- A medicinal cannabis patient or consumer, with an extensive history of medicinal cannabis advocacy or involvement in a cannabis compassionate use program.

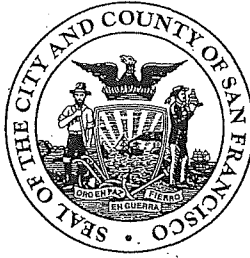
Background Information

This legislative digest reflects amendments adopted by the Rules Committee at its October 3, 2018 meeting. At that meeting, the Rules Committee amended the ordinance to add two non-voting seats to the proposed Committee, change the qualifications for seat 13, require the City Administrator to provide administrative and policy support for the Committee, and require the Committee to provide one report per year instead of two.

This digest also reflects amendments adopted by the Board of Supervisors on October 16, 2018 to change the qualifications for seats 6, 8, and 13.



Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2.21 establishes certain criteria that must be included in legislation creating and establishing, or reauthorizing, new bodies (boards/commissions/task forces/advisory bodies) and requires the Clerk of the Board to advise the Board on certain matters. In order to fulfill these requirements, the following is provided:

File No. 180800 Administrative Code - Cannabis Oversight Committee

The Cannabis Oversight Committee (Committee) would be a new advisory body on the implementation and enforcement of City laws and regulations related to cannabis in San Francisco. This Committee would be codified by adding a new Administrative Code, Article X, Section 5.10-1 through 5.10-8.

- Does a current body address the same or similar subject matter?

The only other advisory body similar to this proposed Committee is the Cannabis State Legalization Task Force (Task Force). The Task Force was created to advise on the "potential" legalization of cannabis, but now that the legalization has occurred this Committee is proposed to be formed and the Task Force is expected to sunset.

- Language requiring the body to meet at least once every four months

Section 5.10-7(a) requires the Committee to hold regular meetings at least five times per year.



- Language indicating members serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority

Section 5.10-5 indicates that all voting members (seats 8-16) shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. Non-voting members (seats 1-7) are specific department heads and/or their designees.

- Language establishing attendance requirements

Section 5.10-5(c) indicates that voting members who miss three regular meetings within a six-month period without approval shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee ten days after the third unapproved absence.

- Number of seats and qualifications

There are seven non-voting members (seats 1-7) and seven voting members (seats 8-16), for a total of 14 members, as follows:

- Seat 1) Director of the Department of Public Health, or their designee;*
- Seat 2) Chief of the Police Department, or their designee;*
- Seat 3) Director of the Department of Building Inspection, or their designee;*
- Seat 4) Director of the Planning Department, or their designee;*
- Seat 5) Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District, or their designee, including a Member of the Board of Education;*
- Seat 6) Member of the Entertainment Commission, appointed by the Entertainment Commission;*
- Seat 7) Chief of the Fire Department, or their designee;*

Appointed by the Board of Supervisors:

- Seat 8) Owner of a Cannabis Business permitted through the Equity Program;*
- Seat 9) Operator of a Cannabis cultivation, manufacturing, or distribution business with fewer than 20 employees at the time of appointment;*
- Seat 10) Representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis business labor force;*
- Seat 11) Representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis delivery service labor force;*
- Seat 12) Owner of a storefront Cannabis retailer;*
- Seat 13) Equity applicant, as defined in Police Code Section 1604(b);*
- Seat 14) A person who demonstrated subject matter expertise on the State of California's Cannabis laws and regulations;*
- Seat 15) A person with significant experience in workforce and economic development;*
and



Seat 16) A person who has been a Medicinal Cannabis patient or Medicinal Cannabis consumer for at least five years, with an extensive history advocating for Medicinal Cannabis patients or involvement in implementing and running a Cannabis compassionate use program.

- Term limits (i.e., commencement date? staggered terms?)

Voting members (seats 8-16) shall serve two-year terms, and non-voting members (seats 1-7) may serve multiple terms since their appointments are part of their department staff duties.

- Administering department

The City Administrator shall provide administrative and policy support for the Committee.

- Reporting requirements

The Committee shall gather and evaluate data and report to the Board of Supervisors and Mayor on the effectiveness of City laws and regulations and the overall health and stability of the Cannabis industry in San Francisco. There are no requirements on how often or when these reports shall be submitted.

- Sunset date

The Committee shall terminate three years after the effective date of the proposed Ordinance, unless the Board of Supervisors extends the term of the Committee.

Dear Honorable Members of the Rules Committee:

I write in response to Board of Supervisors File No. 180800 to express my concern about the impacts to the Office of Cannabis if it is tasked with implementing this ordinance as currently drafted and without additional funding.

The existing workload of the Office of Cannabis (OOC), referenced in Article XXVI, Section 2A.420(b) of the Administrative Code, and further referenced in Section 1601(a) of the San Francisco Police Code, is considerable. With a workload of over 260 permit applications, implementation and further development of the Equity Program, coordination of City enforcement activities, advocacy around state related matters, and community outreach, the continued and growing responsibilities of the Office of Cannabis have already left the three member staff with a workload that has stretched them thin.

As I work to address the current and temporary staffing needs in next year's budget submission, the establishment of a new Committee and extensive data collection and reporting requirements present yet another challenge to the success of this Office that was created only a little over a year ago.

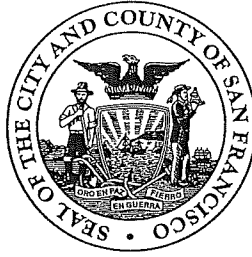
I respectfully request that if the Board chooses to enact this ordinance, it does so with the funding necessary for additional Office of Cannabis staff to provide the requisite administrative and policy support for this committee. Absent this commitment of net new funding to the Office of Cannabis for this committee, I would ask the Board to delay consideration of this measure until it can be considered in the budget process.

(f) Seat 6 shall be held by an Owner of a Cannabis Business permitted through the Equity Program, appointed by the Board.

(g) Seat 7 shall be held by the current or former operator or employee of a Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, or Distribution business with fewer than 20 employees at the time of appointment, appointed by the Board.

(h) Seat 8 shall be held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis business labor force, appointed by the Board.

(i) Seat 9 shall held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis delivery service labor force, appointed by the Board.

(j) Seat 10 shall be held by an Owner of a Storefront Cannabis Retailer, appointed by the Board.

(k) Seat 11 shall be held by a person who lived for at least five years (between 1971-2009) in San Francisco census tracts where at least 17% of the households had incomes at or below the poverty level or who has attended SFUSD school district for at least 5 years or who has been displaced by an eviction in San Francisco, appointed by the Board.

(l) Seat 12 shall be held by a person with demonstrated subject matter expertise on the State of California's Cannabis laws and regulations, appointed by the Board.

(m) Seat 13 shall be held by a person with significant experience in the non-profit sector or in workforce and economic development, appointed by the Board.

(n) Seat 14 shall be held by a person who has been a Medicinal Cannabis patient or Medicinal Cannabis consumer for at least five years, with an

extensive history advocating for Medicinal Cannabis patients or involvement in implementing and running a Cannabis compassionate use program in compliance with the Compassionate Use Act of 1996, appointed by the Board.

(m) Seat 15 shall be held by a current San Francisco resident.

(o) Seat 16 shall be held by an Equity Applicant.

(p) Seat 17 shall be held by an Equity Incubator.

(q) Seat 18 shall be held by a representative from a neighborhood association.

(r) Seat 19 shall be held by a current or former owner or employee of a cannabis business or a current or former owner or employee of a business the provides ancillary services to a cannabis business.
