[Settlement of Lawsuit - Coalition on Homelessness - \$2,828,000]

Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by Coalition On Homelessness against the City and County of San Francisco for \$2,828,000 and non-monetary terms; the lawsuit was filed on September 27, 2022, in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California, Case No. 4:22-cv-05502-DMR; entitled Coalition on Homelessness, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco, et al.; the lawsuit involves Plaintiff's allegation that the City unlawfully seizes property of persons experiencing homelessness without adequate advanced notice, discards property the City should store under the terms of the City's "bag and tag" policy, and fails to store property of persons experiencing homelessness in a way that allows retrieval of the property.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section 6.102(5), the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the City Attorney to settle the Coalition on Homelessness' claims in the action entitled Coalition on Homelessness, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco, et al., United States District Court for the Northern District of California, Case No. 4:22-cv-05502-DMR on substantially the same terms as set forth in the Settlement Agreement on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, which is incorporated by reference and declared to be a part of this ordinance as if set forth fully herein. The Settlement Agreement includes the payment of \$2,828,000 in attorney's fees and costs, as well as an agreement concerning the treatment of property belonging to persons experiencing homelessness. The lawsuit involves Plaintiff's allegation that the City unlawfully seizes property of persons experiencing homelessness without adequate advanced notice, discards property the City

2	persons experiencing homelessness in a way that allows successful retrieval of their property.
3	Section 2. The above-named action was filed in the United States District Court for the
4	Northern District of California on September 27, 2022, and the following parties were named

9	Supportive Housing; San Francisco Fire Department; San Francisco Department of
10	Emergency Management.
