

REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST
(Amended in Committee – February 6, 0220)

[Administrative Code - Crime Victim Data Reporting]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to require the Police Department to regularly report certain crime victim data pertaining to victims of Hate Crimes and other specified crimes (Assault, Aggravated Assault, Child and Elder Abuse, Sexual Assault, First and Second Degree Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, Robbery, Battery, Vandalism, Domestic Violence, Manslaughter, and Murder).

Existing Law

Administrative Code Chapter 96A requires the Police and Sheriff's Department to collect data regarding officers' encounters with citizens, and to report quarterly data regarding officers' encounters, arrests, and use of force.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would amend Administrative Code Chapter 96A to require the Police Department to report quarterly crime victim data for each reported Assault, Aggravated Assault, Child and Elder Abuse, Sexual Assault, First and Second Degree Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, Robbery, Battery, Vandalism, Domestic Violence, Manslaughter, Murder, and Hate Crime.

Background
