

1 [Performance Contract - California Department of Health Care Services - Behavioral Health
2 Services Act and Various Behavioral Health Programs]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Department of Public Health to enter into Performance**
4 **Contract No. 26-60056, with the California Department of Health Care Services,**
5 **incorporating the Behavioral Health Services Act, Lanterman-Petris-Short Act, Projects**
6 **for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness, Community Mental Health Services**
7 **Block Grant, Substance Use Prevention, Treatment and Recovery Services Block**
8 **Grant, and Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program for the period of July 1,**
9 **2026, through June 30, 2029.**

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11 WHEREAS, The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) administers
12 funding and program requirements/standards for the following: Behavioral Health Services Act
13 (BHSA), Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) Act, Projects for Assistance in Transition from
14 Homelessness (PATH), Community Mental Health Services Block Grant (known as Mental
15 Health Block Grant (MHBG)), Substance Use Prevention, Treatment and Recovery Services
16 Block Grant (SUBG), and Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training Program (CCP); and

17 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health, Behavioral Health Services (DPH-BHS)
18 operates the aforementioned programs for San Francisco County through the San Francisco
19 Mental Health Plan; and

20 WHEREAS, The Behavioral Health Services Fund was established pursuant to Welfare
21 and Institutions Code, Section 5890, and provides funds to counties for the implementation of
22 its BHSA projects and programs for behavioral health services and supports, Full-Service
23 Partnerships, and housing interventions; and

24 WHEREAS, The Lanterman-Petris-Short Act was established pursuant to Welfare and
25 Institutions Code, Section 5400, to end indefinite involuntary commitment of persons with

1 mental health disorders and to provide prompt evaluation and treatment, to establish
2 consistent personal rights standards, and to provide services in the least restrictive setting;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Pursuant to 42 United States Code, Sections 290cc-21 through 290cc-35,
5 the PATH grant funds community-based outreach, mental health and substance use disorder
6 referral/treatment, case management and other support services, as well as a limited set of
7 housing services for the homeless mentally ill; and

8 WHEREAS, DHCS awards federal Community Mental Health Services Block Grant
9 funds to counties in California to provide a broad array of mental health services to the
10 following target populations: children and youth with serious emotional disturbances, adults
11 and older adults with serious mental illnesses; and

12 WHEREAS, Pursuant to 42 U.S. Code, Section 300x-1 et seq., the State of California
13 has been awarded the federal Substance Use Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery Services
14 Block Grant funds to provide a broad array of substance use treatment and prevention
15 services; and

16 WHEREAS, Pursuant to 42 U.S. Code, Section 5183, and upon the issuance of a
17 Presidential declaration of a major disaster, the State of California may be awarded Federal
18 Emergency Management Agency funding for the Crisis Counseling Assistance and Training
19 Program which supports short-term interventions that involve assisting disaster survivors in
20 understanding their current situation, mitigating stress, developing coping strategies, providing
21 emotional support, and linkages with other individuals and agencies that help survivors in their
22 recovery process; and

23 WHEREAS, on February 25, 2026, DHCS forwarded Performance Contract No. 26-
24 60056 to DPH-BHS, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, which
25 is hereby declared to be part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and

1 WHEREAS, DHCS requires the Board of Supervisors approve Performance Contract
2 No. 26-60056, ensuring County commitment to complying with the program requirements and
3 that the County is committed to providing necessary resources for performance; and

4 WHEREAS, Performance Contract No. 26-60056 sets forth all performance,
5 compliance and reporting requirements the County must meet in order to receive funding for
6 these programs; and

7 WHEREAS, Examples of compliance and reporting standards include, but are not
8 limited to, expenditure requirements, minimum service standards, beneficiary protections, and
9 fiscal and service reporting requirements; and

10 WHEREAS, The Performance Contract ensures the City meets requirements to receive
11 funding for the programs listed above, and which are authorized separately by the Board of
12 Supervisors as part of the City's annual budget process; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco, Department of Public Health (DPH) is
14 hereby authorized to enter into Performance Contract No. 26-60056 with DHCS; and, be it

15 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby designates the Director
16 of Behavioral Health Services to sign said agreement on behalf of DPH; and, be it

17 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of
18 Behavioral Health Services to make any modifications to the Performance Contract, prior to its
19 final execution by all parties and during the term of the Performance Contract approved
20 herein, that DPH determines, in consultation with the City Attorney, are consistent with this
21 Resolution, in the best interest of the City, do not materially increase the obligations or
22 liabilities of the City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate and maintain or continue the
23 purposes of the Performance Contract, and are in compliance with all applicable laws,
24 including the City's Charter; and, be it

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1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the Performance Contract being
2 fully executed by all parties, the Director of Behavioral Health Services shall provide the
3 Performance Contract to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion into the official file.

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
