3 **Resolution approving the FY2011-2012 Emergency Shelter Grants (ESG) Program; and**
4 **authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to apply for,**
5 **accept, and expend the City's FY2011-2012 Emergency Shelter Grants Program**
6 **entitlement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the**
7 **amount of \$1,253,445 and to expend Reprogrammed Funds in the amount of \$124,000.**

8
9 WHEREAS, Under the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act and Cranston
10 Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, the Secretary of the U.S. Department of
11 Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is authorized to make a grant to the City and County
12 of San Francisco under the Emergency Shelter Grants Program (ESG); and,

13 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving \$1,253,445 in
14 FY2011-2012 ESG Program funds from HUD; and,

15 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has \$124,000 in ESG funds from
16 previous years that have not yet been expended (the Reprogrammed Funds); and,

17 WHEREAS, The Citizen's Committee on Community Development (CCCD) has
18 prepared recommendations for FY2011-2012 ESG funding as set forth in a proposed
19 Expenditure Schedule, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 110561; and,

20 WHEREAS, The ESG Program funds will be used to provide for the rehabilitation or
21 conversion of buildings for use as emergency shelters for the homeless, for the payment of
22 certain operating and social service expenses in connection with emergency shelters and for
23 homeless prevention activities; and,

24 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance
25 amendment; and,

1 WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of the grant on indirect
2 costs; and,

3 WHEREAS, An Environmental Review Record has been prepared by the Mayor's
4 Office of Housing (MOH) and approved by the Certifying Officer for the proposed projects and
5 activities as described in the Expenditure Schedule in accordance with the National
6 Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable statutes and authorities, in particular
7 those cited in 24 CFR Part 58 §§5 and 6, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 110561;
8 and,

9 WHEREAS, The Certifying Officer shall follow the procedural provisions of NEPA to
10 confirm and ensure that all projects funded under the ESG Program are in compliance with
11 applicable federal regulations and requirements; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby
13 authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2011-2012 ESG Program entitlement
14 from HUD and expend \$124,000 in Reprogrammed Funds in accordance with the purposes
15 and goals for the funding as generally set forth in the 2010-14 Five-Year Consolidated Plan
16 and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

17 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the
18 purposes and goals for the funding as set forth in the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
20 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute
22 agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and various agencies consistent
23 with the FY2011-2012 ESG Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it



5 applicable legal requirements; and, be it



AMOUNT: \$23,499,022.00

Due to ongoing uncertainty in the development of the 2011 Federal Budget the amounts of individual grants to sub-recipients are estimates and set at a not to exceed level.

DESCRIPTION: The project consists of overall non-construction costs for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Programs.

The resources of the CDBG program will be used by the City and County of San Francisco to develop flexible, locally designed community development strategies to address the program's primary objective, which is the development of viable urban communities. San Francisco's CDBG program revitalizes neighborhoods by funding local programs that develops workforces, economic development, housing and improved community facilities and services.

The San Francisco ESG program will improve the quality of existing emergency shelters for the homeless; provide additional emergency shelters; help meet the costs of operating emergency shelters; and provide certain essential social services to homeless individuals. The program also funds preventive programs and activities that will reduce the number of people who become homeless

The City and County will use HOME funds for rehabilitation, new construction, acquisition of affordable housing and tenant-based rental assistance

HOPWA program funds will be used to prevent homelessness of persons with HIV/AIDS and to meet the housing needs of persons with HIV/AIDS, including lease/rental assistance, shared housing arrangements, apartments, single room occupancy (SRO) dwellings and community residences. Supportive services may also be included in the program.

All costs addressed in this Programmatic Review are limited to non-construction activities. These costs include but are not limited to Architectural, Design and Engineering Services for Capital Projects; Program Administration; Housing Program Administration; Technical Assistance; Planning, Housing Program Grants and Public Services including but not limited to: vocational training, legal, fair housing, children's and health services, business and educational counseling programs for low/moderate income households and qualifying businesses. The project also includes Community Economic Development activities that lead to the employment of low-income persons. A large number of sub-recipient organizations as well as City agencies are involved in the listed activities. (See attached Table 2.)
