WHEREAS, Recent events beyond San Francisco's reach, including the national economic recession, terrorist attacks, the war, and recent SARS epidemic in Asia have decreased tourist visitation to San Francisco, have presented tremendous economic challenges to business owners in Chinatown; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors reaffirms its recognition of the tremendous cultural, civic, and economic value of Chinatown to the City of San Francisco and the State of California; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors pledges to partner with leaders in Chinatown, as well as important international dignitaries, to foster a healthy business and community environment in Chinatown, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors will actively support efforts to stimulate visitation to Chinatown, including the recently initiated nightly lion dance down Grant Avenue, a "scrub-down" campaign to maintain cleanliness in eating and public establishments, and the restoration of the Koban on Grant Avenue which will host the Chinatown Visitors Information Center.
