COMMEMORATING THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CASTRO SWEEP AND FURTHER EXPRESSING THE HOPE THAT TRAGIC EVENTS SUCH AS THE CASTRO SWEEP SHALL NEVER BE REPEATED AND FURTHER COMMENDING LOCAL QUEER ACTIVISTS, COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND THE SAN FRANCISCO POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR WORKING DILIGENTLY TO IMPROVE AND ENHANCE RELATIONS BETWEEN THE SAN FRANCISCO POLICE OFFICERS AND THE SAN FRANCISCO GAY, LESBIAN, BISEXUAL AND TRANSGENDER QUEER COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, On Friday, October 6, 1989, a small group of peaceful protesters staged a march demonstrated against the federal neglect of people with HIV/AIDS; and

WHEREAS, At the culmination of the march, approximately 200 San Francisco Police Officers, about half of the number of officers on duty that night, converged on the Castro and proceeded to beat protesters and innocent bystanders; and

WHEREAS, The police crackdown of the protesters has come to be known as the "Castro Sweep" and remains the single most massive official attack on gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender humans rights in the history of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Since that time, local activists have been working with the San Francisco Police Department to mitigate violence between the police and the gay community and ways to work together; and

WHEREAS, In addition to the creation of a Hate Crimes Unit in the San Francisco
Police Department, there have been pro-active attempts to recruit gay, lesbian, bisexual and
transgender officers into the Police department as well staffing of gay districts with gay officers
; and

FURTHER RESOVED, That the Board of Supervisors expresses the hope that tragic events such as the Castro Sweep shall never be repeated in San Francisco; and let it be

FURTHER RESOVED, That the Board of Supervisors commends local queer activists, community based organizations and the San Francisco Police Department for working diligently to improve and enhance relations between the San Francisco Police officers and the San Francisco gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender queer communities.
