Ordinance amending the Health Code to set patient rates for services provided by the Department of Public Health for Fiscal Years 2026-2027 and 2027-2028.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Article 3 of the Health Code is hereby amended by revising Section 128, to read as follows:

SEC. 128. PATIENT RATES.

(a) The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby determine and fix the proper reasonable amounts to be charged to persons for services furnished by the Department of Public Health (“Department”) as follows, which rates shall be effective for services delivered as of July 1, 2026~~5~~, through June 30, 2028~~7~~. The County Clerk’s Office may charge the amounts listed herein for services rendered relating to vital records.

San Francisco Health Network

In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under

1 the official title of the ordinance.

3 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after
4 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
5 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
6 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Ordinance amending the Health Code to set patient rates for services provided by the Department of Public Health for Fiscal Years 2026-2027 and 2027-2028.

Existing Law

San Francisco Health Code Section 128 sets forth the amounts to be charged for patient care provided by the Department of Public Health ("DPH"). Currently, Section 128 sets the rates for services rendered in Fiscal Years 2025-2026 and 2026-2027.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would set the amounts to be charged for patient care provided by DPH in Fiscal Years 2026-2027 (July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027) and 2027-2028 (July 1, 2027 to June 30, 2028).

File 260600: Health Code - Patient Rates Ordinance amends the Health Code to set patient rates provided by the Department of Public Health (DPH).

- The proposed ordinance would set the amounts to be charged for patient care provided by DPH in Fiscal Years 2026-2027 and 2027-2028.
- The primary purpose of setting competitive rates is to ensure adequate compensation from **commercial insurance companies** – DPH evaluate and sets patient rates annually to ensure revenue from Medicare, Medi-Cal, and private insurance.
- To ensure patients remain protected from unexpected medical bills for services received at DPH facilities we have two coordinated policies - charity care and discount payments programs.
 - The ordinance authorizes DPH to waive or reduce its fees charged to a patient if the patient or person legally obligated to pay the patient's fees meets the eligibility requirements established by DPH for financial assistance programs, charity care and discount payments programs.

Health Code – Patient Rates



- **Analytical Rigor:** DPH partnered with the Controller's Office City Performance Unit and engaged HMA to review its patient rates - to develop a patient rates model factoring in managed care, market, and cost considerations.
- **Extension of Existing Rates:** For services where DPH rates exceed market benchmarks, extend current rates through FY 2027–28. This includes, but is not limited to, Non-ICU Inpatient Services and Trauma Services.
- **Physical Health Rates:** Apply CPI growth to all other physical health services, increases of 2.18% and 3.04% in FY 2026-27 and FY 2027-28, respectively.
- **Specialty Mental Health and Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System:** Apply State fee schedule increases of 3.10% to match state BHS Medi-Cal Fee Schedule
- **Revisions to the Rate Schedule for FY 2026–27 and FY 2027–28:**
 - Increase ICU by 6.00% rates to meet market benchmarks
 - Add rates for Specialty Mental Health Services related to Traditional Healer and Community In Reach and High Fidelity Wrap bundled payments.
 - Remove fees related to reproduction of documents and Medical Marijuana ID cards

Administrative Codes – Weights and Measures Fees



- Under SF Admin Code § 1.13-5, the ordinance aligns state and local fee structure by increasing water submeter fees from \$2 to \$6, and vapor submeter fees from \$4 to \$10 per device per space or apartment.
- Authorizes annual adjustment of select device fees up to the maximum allowed under Cal. B&P Code § 12240, without further Board approval.

- Approval ensures DPH can meet State documentation requirements and receive funds on time, preventing delays and maintaining continuity of critical community-based services.

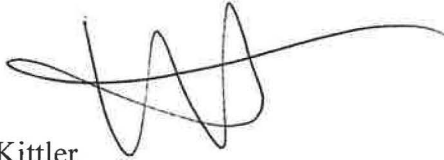
