

1 [Small Business Year 2000 Readiness Act]  
2 URGING CONGRESS TO PASS THE SMALL BUSINESS YEAR 2000 READINESS ACT

4 WHEREAS, The failure of many computer programs to recognize the Year 2000 will  
5 have extreme negative financial consequences in the Year 2000 and in subsequent years for  
6 businesses and the public at large; and,

7 WHEREAS, Small businesses are behind larger businesses in implementing corrective  
8 changes to their automated systems; and,

9 WHEREAS, Many small businesses do not have access to capital to fix their  
10 automated systems; and,

11 WHEREAS, Senator Christopher Bond (R-Mo) has introduced the Small Business  
12 Year 2000 Readiness Act (S. 2372); and,

13 WHEREAS, The Small Business Year 2000 Readiness Act requires the Small  
14 Business Administration (SBA) to establish a pilot loan guarantee program under which the  
15 SBA guarantees 50 percent of the principal amount of the loans made by eligible private  
16 lenders to assist small businesses in solving Year 2000 computer problems; and,

17 WHEREAS, The Small Business Year 2000 Readiness Act is on file with the Clerk of  
18 the Board of Supervisors in File No. 98-1654 ; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco  
20 urges Congress to pass the Small Business Year 2000 Readiness Act; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the  
22 Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from California in Congress.


