3	Ordinance amending the Municipal Elections Code to amend Section 830 to require
4	that the Controller set the fees for publication of ballot arguments in the Voter
5	Information Pamphlet, and establish criteria for setting this fee so that the fee
6	approximates but does not exceed the actual cost of publication.

8	deletions are strikethrough italics Times New Roman. Board amendment additions are double underlined.
9	Board amendment deletions are strikethrough normal.
10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
11	Section 1. The San Francisco Municipal Elections Code is hereby amended by
12	amending Section 830, to read as follows:
13	Sec. 830. BALLOT ARGUMENT FEES.
14	At the time that the author of a ballot argument submits the argument for publication as
15	a paid argument, the author shall pay a ballot argument filing fee as determined by the Controller
16	under this Section.
17	(a) Estimation of Costs. In advance of each election at which ballot measures will be
18	presented to the voters, the Controller shall estimate the cost of publishing a ballot argument in the
19	Voter Information Pamphlet. When estimating the publication cost, the Controller shall consider: the
20	estimated size of the Pamphlet; the number and complexity of ballot measures; the cost estimates
21	gathered by the Department of Elections concerning producing and distributing the Pamphlet; and the
22	actual cost of publishing ballot arguments in the Pamphlet in past years. The Controller may consider
23	other information that the Controller considers relevant.
24	(b) Determination of Fee. After the Controller estimates the cost of publishing a ballot
25	argument in the Voter Information Pamphlet under subsection (a), the Controller shall set the

1	publication fee at 90 percent of the estimated cost. If the Controller finds that the publication fees
2	collected in past years exceeded the actual cost of publication, the Controller may set the publication
3	fee at less than 90 percent of the estimated cost. If the Controller finds that the publication fees
4	collected in past years fell short of the actual cost of publication, the Controller may set the publication
5	fee at more than 90 percent but no more than 100 percent of the estimated cost.
6	(c) Timing. The Controller shall inform the Director of Elections of the ballot argument
7	publication fee no later than 80 days before the election.
