The San Francisco Fire Department (SFFD) Fire Training Facility.

2. Explanation of your organization being a non-profit (501c3) or government organization (For-profit entities are NOT eligible for community project funding)

The SFFD provides fire suppression, emergency medical services and disaster response under the authority of the City and County of San Francisco (CCSF) to ensure the health and safety of its population and protection of its infrastructure.

It's important to note the magnitude of the infrastructure the SFFD protects with collectively almost 500 Designated Historical Landmarks and over a thousand critical infrastructure to include but not limited to major sports arenas, reservoirs, water treatment facilities, under bay fuel transmission lines, power grids, medical facilities, and financial institutions including a Federal Reserve Bank. San Francisco, a natural peninsula, has two major bridges and the Port of San Francisco, oversees a cruise ship terminal, expected to resume the hosting of over 300,000 passengers annually.

The City's 47.355 square mileage is geographically circuitous and its infrastructure is distinctively susceptible to fire with approximately 48,000 Victorian houses primarily constructed of wood, and roughly 380,971 housing units, 72 high-rises and 26 skyscrapers.

The City's location makes it subject to the effects of harsh weather, seismic related incidents, and the effects of climate change, which have contributed to recent power outages, road and bridge hazards, and urban and wildland fires. Furthermore, San Francisco is a designated top seven Tier1 Urban Area Ranking city by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, meaning the destruction of its infrastructure would inflict catastrophic consequences on the population. The inclusion of the Emergency Operations Center at the SFFD's Fire Training Facility is essential to the protection of the city and region.

3. Appropriations Subcommittee and Account that you are requesting funding from (Please note that Labor, Health, and Human Services are NOT eligible for community project funding this year)

The San Francisco Fire Department is requesting funding from the Homeland Security Subcommittee – Federal Emergency Management Agency – Federal Assistance for Emergency Operation Centers.

### 4. Amount of Funding Requested

The San Francisco Fire Department is requesting five million dollars (\$5,000,000) in Community Project Funding.

The current general obligation to fund this project is through the Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response 2020 – Neighborhood Firehouse, bond for 272 million dollars (\$272,000,000.)

Requested project funding is based on the following costs and calculated by the square footage of the overall Administration building dedicated to the Emergency operations Center (\$2,421,233), upgrades to uninterrupted power supply (\$87,00), and the costs associated with Essential Building systems (\$2,491,767.)The amounts below represent estimated construction costs. They do not include land acquisition, administrative costs, or bond costs.

### 7. General description of the project and why it is needed

The proposed Emergency Operations Center project is an approved and planned portion of the Administration and Classroom building of the Fire Training Facility. The Administration building is scheduled as an "Essential Building" and will meet all seismic requirements of an emergency response facility. There is a tiered classroom with space and technology to operate as a Fire Department Operations Center and temporary Emergency operations Center.

The current Fire Department Operations Center is in a technology challenged and cramped area within the Fire Department headquarters building. The San Francisco Department of Emergency Management is currently in a temporary Emergency Operations Center and would benefit from the availability of a new and seismically safe alternative space.

8. Benefits of this project and why is it a priority

The addition of an Emergency Operations Center at the Fire Training Facility was recognized early in the design process as a desirable contingency. As the need for a functional Emergency Operations Center has been highlighted by recent storm events the reduced scale of the Emergency operations component of the Fire Training Center has been reevaluated. Large reductions in the overall scope of the project due to high construction costs are ongoing, however awarded Community Project Funding would ensure the Emergency Operations Center function can remain intact.

9. Explanation of how your project benefit disadvantaged or tribal communities, address issues of climate change or equity, or benefit any specific neighborhoods in San Francisco

The project will greatly benefit multiple underserved and historically marginalized communities of San Francisco by ensuring continuity of vital emergency services during disaster to reduce further community disruption. The disadvantaged communities of San Francisco strongly rely on the rapid response and strategic coordination that this new Emergency Operation Center will support. The Emergency Operations Center is a key part of the greater Fire Training Facility. The Training Facility will be constructed on a plot in the city currently being used for illegal dumping, ensuring the development of this site into will provide a secure, interesting, and active public safety asset for the Bayview/Hunter's Point neighborhood. The site will also provide space for SFFD recruitment center, public classroom and meeting spaces and safe spaces for community outreach activities. The overall project will be constructed to a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold standard ensuring environmental and community benefit.

Funding is being requested from Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Federal Assistance – Emergency Operations Centers.

11. Estimated project start and completion date

The Fire Training Facility is currently in the schematic design phase with an estimated substantial completion date of August 2028.

The SFFD's Training facility project was part of Proposition B voted on by San Francisco voters. After much outreach and public information efforts, the measure was approved overwhelmingly by an 82.84% to 17.16% margin. Supporting documentation is attached.

A site was identified, and there was legislation through the San Francisco Board of Supervisors to approve the purchase. Public Hearings were held, and this purchase was approved overwhelmingly by the Board of Supervisors. The following link can be accessed for more information about that process:

In addition to the purchase approval, California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) hearings were held, and findings were adopted after being presented to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors.

Furthermore, a portion of the project involves purchasing land from the Port of San Francisco. As such, approval was needed at the State Lands Committee for us to move forward. There were efforts made to secure this approval, and the California legislature approved this purchase as part of our project proposal.
