AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 359-98, CREATING AN ADVISORY DOGS OFF-LEASH TASK FORCE TO CONSIDER AND RECOMMEND AN EFFECTIVE OFF-LEASH POLICY, TO CONSIDER ALTERNATIVE WAYS TO CREATIVELY FINANCE THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH INCREASING THE NUMBER OF DOG OFF-LEASH AREAS IN NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS, AND TO CONSIDER AND RECOMMEND HOW THE CITY CAN EFFECTIVELY AND FAIRLY ENFORCE ITS LAWS AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO DOGS BY EXTENDING THE SUNSET DATE OF THE ADVISORY DOGS OFF-LEASH TASK FORCE TO MARCH 4, 1999.

WHEREAS, The number of dogs in the City and County of San Francisco has increased while the areas available to dog owners to let their dogs run off-leash has decreased; and

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Department currently has seventeen designated off-leash areas, four of which are located in Golden Gate Park; and

WHEREAS, There has been testimony before the Board of Supervisors of the need for more areas for dog owners to permit their dogs to run-off leash within their neighborhood parks; and

WHEREAS, There has been testimony before the Board of Supervisors of the need to enforce Sections of the Health Code pertaining to dogs and the responsibilities of dog owners; and

WHEREAS, There has been testimony before the Board of Supervisors on how the needs and requirements of other park users and park resources may conflict with needs of dog owners to permit their dogs to run off-leash; and

WHEREAS, There has been testimony before the Board of Supervisors about the need of community groups and associations, including groups and associations formed around a profound love of dogs, to participate in the development of any off-leash policy; and be it

RESOLVED, That members of the Task Force shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and such appointments shall be made by May 28, 1998; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco establishes an Advisory Dogs Off-Leash Task Force consisting of thirteen members who will represent the following officials and groups: the Mayor of San Francisco or his designee, a member of the Board of Supervisors, the Chief of the San Francisco Police Department or his designee, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department or his designee, the Chair of the San Francisco Commission of Animal Control and Welfare, the Director of Animal Care and Control or the Director's designee, the Director of

the Environmental Health Department or the Director's designee, the Superintendent of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area or his designee, the President of the SPCA or his designee and a designee from each of the following entities: Coleman Advocates, Noe Courts Coalition, SF Dog, and Fund for Animals. For example, (1) the Mayor or a designee appointed by the Mayor, (2) a member of the Board of Supervisors appointed by the Board of Supervisors, (3) the Chief of the San Francisco Police Department or a designee appointed by the Chief of Police, (4) the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department or a designee appointed by the General Manager, (5) the Director of Animal Care and Control or a designee appointed by the Director, (6) the Chair of the Animal Control and Welfare Commission or a designee appointed by the Chair, (7) the Director of the Environmental Health Department or a designee appointed by (8) Superintendent of the Golden Gate Director, the National Recreation Area or a designee appointed by the Superintendent, (9) the President of the SPCA or a designee appointed by the President, and the Board of Supervisors shall appoint the four remaining Task Force members; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Advisory Task Force on Dogs Off-Leash shall report on the following:

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- 1. An effective off-leash policy which will enable the City and County of San Francisco to increase the number of dog off-leash areas in neighborhood parks while equitably balancing that need against the needs and requirements of other park users and park resources.
- 2. Alternative ways to creatively finance the costs associated with increasing the number of dog off-leash areas in neighborhood parks, including private sector involvement.
- 3. How the city can effectively and fairly enforce its laws and regulations pertaining to dogs, in particular section 40., section 41.12. and section 41.15 of the San Francisco Health Code.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appointment of members to the Advisory Off-Leash Dogs Task Force shall automatically expire on March 4, 1999; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall be staffed by the Department of Recreation and Park Department.
