10	WHEREAS, Mental health services are essential for public safety within the City and
11	County of San Francisco; and
12	WHEREAS, Out-patient mental health preventative care can avert hospitalizations and
13	future homelessness; and
14	WHEREAS, Mental health services provided by the Department of Public Health is a
15	safety net for the uninsured, Medi-cal, and indigent patients in San Francisco; and
16	WHEREAS, The OMI Family Center has a 29-year history of serving the members of
17	the Oceanview-Merced-Ingleside (OMI) community as well as community members from all
18	over the city; and
19	WHEREAS, About one third of its 600 clients are children from schools all over the
20	City of San Francisco and,
21	WHEREAS, OMI residents who otherwise might not seek treatment because of
22	mobility or transportation limitations are able to receive services from the OMI Family Clinic
23	because of its convenient location in the OMI; and,
24	WHEREAS, The staff's dedication to quality care for patients prompts clients from all
25	over the city to seek services at the OMI Family Center; and,

1	WHEREAS, The OMI Family Center has never closed its doors to patients in need;
2	now, therefore, be it
3	RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges
4	the Mayor to preserve mental health services throughout the City and County of San
5	Francisco and the vital resources the OMI Family Center provides for the residents of San
6	Francisco.
