DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM; AND APPROVING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE MIOCR STRATEGY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, Due to the deinstitutionalization of severely mentally ill individuals that occurred in the 1970's, many mentally ill people now remain untreated, resulting in impaired functioning, poverty, homelessness, and self-medication with alcohol and controlled substances; and,

WHEREAS, These behaviors often necessitate police intervention resulting in incarceration; and,

WHEREAS, The State Board of Corrections has made available funding, in accordance with the provisions of Senate Bill 1485, Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction grants, for development of programs designed to reduce jail crowding, crime and criminal justice costs, while addressing the needs of mentally ill offenders during incarceration and upon release; and,

WHEREAS, the State requires that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Sheriff to apply for such funding; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the grant application and companion Local Plan will be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990340 ; and,
