2 AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT TO APPLY for A FOUR-YEAR GRANT
3 IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$7,000,000 FROM THE STATE BOARD OF
4 CORRECTIONS FOR MENTALLY ILL OFFENDER CRIME REDUCTION (MIOCR)
5 DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM; AND APPROVING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE MIOCR
6 STRATEGY COMMITTEE.

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8 WHEREAS, Due to the deinstitutionalization of severely mentally
9 ill individuals that occurred in the 1970's, many mentally ill people
10 now remain untreated, resulting in impaired functioning, poverty,
11 homelessness, and self-medication with alcohol and controlled
12 substances; and,

13 WHEREAS, These behaviors often necessitate police intervention
14 resulting in incarceration; and,

15 WHEREAS, The State Board of Corrections has made available
16 funding, in accordance with the provisions of Senate Bill 1485,
17 Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction grants, for development of
18 programs designed to reduce jail crowding, crime and criminal justice
19 costs, while addressing the needs of mentally ill offenders during
20 incarceration and upon release; and,

21 WHEREAS, the State requires that the Board of Supervisors
22 authorize the Sheriff to apply for such funding; and,

23 WHEREAS, A copy of the grant application and companion Local
24 Plan will be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File
25 No. 990340 ; and,

6 related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of

9 Michael Hennessey as the Chair of the San Francisco Mentally Ill
10 Offender Crime Reduction Strategy Committee; and be it

15 adhere to the requirements of the Board of Corrections and all
16 conditions specified in the grant contract with the State of
17 California in the expenditure of State funds received pursuant to
18 said application; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will
20 participate in the collection of required common research data,
21 program evaluation activities ~~activities~~ and conduct an evaluation of their
22 proposed project; and be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will
24 invoice the Board of Corrections for all costs approved in the grant
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
1 on a quarterly basis beginning October 1, 1999 and not later than


