URGING THE NEWLY-MERGED EXXON MOBIL CORPORATION TO REVERSE ITS NEW POLICIES OF NOT OFFERING HEALTH CARE COVERAGE TO DOMESTIC PARTNERS OF ITS LESBIAN AND GAY EMPLOYEES OR PROHIBITING DISCRIMINATION ON THE

BASIS OF SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND TO ADOPT MOBIL'S PREVIOUS POLICY OF

PROVIDING SUCH BENEFITS AND PROTECTIONS.

WHEREAS, Companies throughout the United States have in recent years increasingly been offering health care coverage to the partners of their lesbian and gay employees; and,

WHEREAS, These companies have also established written policies explicitly prohibiting anti-gay discrimination in the workplace; and,

WHEREAS, Since lesbian and gay employees are not legally allowed to marry, offering health care benefits to domestic partners and prohibiting anti-gay discrimination are important ways in which corporate America can level the playing field among all employees regardless of sexual orientation, and

WHEREAS, The Mobil Corporation had, before its merger with Exxon, been among 74 Fortune 500 companies to offer such benefits and protections; and

WHEREAS, The new Exxon Mobil Corporation decided not to offer domestic partnership benefits to its employees who did not already have such coverage after November 30, 1999 as well as not to issue a policy of non-discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, This decision represents a step backward in the recognition and validation of lesbian and gay relationships and is tantamount to not offering equal pay for equal work; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the newly-merged Exxon Mobil Corporation to reverse its policy of not offering health care coverage to domestic partners of its lesbian and gay employees or prohibiting discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and to adopt Mobil's previous policy of providing such benefits and protections; and, be it
