WHEREAS, The Black Adoption Placement and Research Center has decided to take a proactive stance to this problem, being concerned that too many African American children are in foster care or waiting to be adopted, and,

WHEREAS, other local agencies such as the Family Builders by Adoption and the San Francisco Department of Human Services supports the Black Adoption Placement and Research Center in its efforts; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco extends its highest commendation to the Black Adoption Placement and Research Center for its efforts to place African American foster children in permanent homes.
