Resolution recognizing and supporting the San Francisco Museum and Historical Society, the successor organization to the Museum of the City of San Francisco, as the official historical museum of the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The Museum of the City of San Francisco ("Museum") was opened in 1991 to present exhibitions depicting the history of the City of San Francisco from its origins as a Spanish garrison, to its renown as a Gold Rush boom town, to the world attention directed at it as a famous "Earthquake City," and depicting the lives of the people who – then and now – have called San Francisco their home; and

WHEREAS, The Museum's objectives are:

- (1) To acquire, collect, organize, preserve and exhibit materials relating to the history of the City of San Francisco and its surrounding area,
- (2) To act as a repository for original research materials regarding the numerous San Francisco earthquakes,
- (3) To disseminate historical information about both the facts and myths of the City's past, and
- (4) to serve as a resource center for interested visitors and San Franciscans, as well as for students and scholars; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution Number 173-95 in 1995 urging the Mayor to recognize the "Museum of the City of San Francisco" as the official historical museum of the City and County of San Francisco, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 197-95-4; and

WHEREAS, Since the re-opening of City Hall in January 1999, the Museum has exhibited San Francisco historical materials in the City Hall South Light Court to thousands of City Hall visitors, including Bay Area residents, students and tourists; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Historical Society ("Historical Society") was organized in 1988 to preserve, interpret and present the historical heritage of San Francisco from its variegated natural history to its lively human history; and

WHEREAS, The mission of the Historical Society is to preserve, interpret, present and disseminate historical data, information, and knowledge relating to the City and County of San Francisco so as to enhance the experience of living in or visiting San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The Museum and Historical Society have agreed to merge into a new entity, to be known as the San Francisco Museum and Historical Society; and

WHEREAS, The merged entity would continue to carry out the objectives of the Museum and the Historical Society; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors finds that there is a strong public interest in the presentation of information and ongoing exhibitions to the public regarding the history of the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors finds that there is a strong public interest in cataloging, preserving and maintaining a collection that focuses on the historical and cultural artifacts of the City and County of San Francisco for scholarly research and education;

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors finds that there is a strong public benefit to have a San Francisco museum and historical society for the use and enjoyment of San Francisco residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, The Museum, upon completion of the merger with the Historical Society, will be replaced by the successor organization known as the San Francisco Museum and

Historical Society and the City will no longer have an officially recognized historical museum; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors recognizes and supports the San Francisco Museum and Historical Society, the successor organization to the Museum of the City of San Francisco, as the official historical museum of the City and County of San Francisco.
