WHEREAS, on Thursday, September 14, 2000, San Francisco lost one of her most illustrious civic treasures with the death of former Mayor George Christopher; and

WHEREAS, George Christopher was born in Arcadia, Greece to James Christopheles and Mary Kiones Christopheles and immigrated to San Francisco in 1910 and settled in the South of Market area of the City; and

WHEREAS, George Christopher personified the promise of the American Dream, rising from poverty and limited formal education to become a very successful owner of Christopher Dairy Farms; and

WHEREAS, George Christopher married the former Tula Sarantitis and $\frac{\text{her}}{\text{enjoyed many happy years as}}$ spouse $\frac{\text{and brother}}{\text{and}}$; and

WHEREAS, Amidst successful business enterprises George Christopher entered the political arena, having been elected to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in 1945 and re-elected in 1949 with 170,756 votes, the most ever obtained by a candidate for that office; and

WHEREAS, George Christopher was elected in mayor of San Francisco in 1955 and 1959, a time of great social and economic change in the City; and

WHEREAS, Among his many achievements, none endeared him more to the people of San Francisco than the acquisition of the New York Giants as a San Francisco team in 1958; and

WHEREAS, on March 22, 1996, Mayor George Christopher's good friend Lee Housekeeper had the opportunity to provide the following anecdotes after interviewing the former mayor: George Christopher played second base for the industrial supply firm "Pacific Motors"; and

WHEREAS, Shortly after assuming office, Mayor George Christopher received a telephone call from Boston Red Sox manager Joe Cronin, a Sacred Heart alum, giving Christopher the "heads-up" that there were rumors that the New York Giants were considering moving out of New York; and

WHEREAS, Fast and furious deliberations began with Walter O'Malley of the Brooklyn Dodgers, Horace Stoneham of the New York Giants and L.A. Mayor Norris Poulson, each of these figures being most evasive with Mayor George Christopher about their intentions for West Coast major league baseball; and

WHEREAS, Undaunted, in 1958 Mayor George Christopher made it clear that major league baseball would be coming to San Francisco: "San Francisco doesn't care if it gets the Dodgers or the Giants, but one of you will be coming here and I am getting on the next plane for New York"...and the rest is history; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors joins with the people of San Francisco in expressing its deepest sympathies to the family of Mayor George Christopher and further expressing its gratitude for the many gifts Mayor George Christopher brought to bear on San Francisco, not least among them the San Francisco Giants, for which he will forever remain in our hearts.
