3 **Ordinance amending the Administrative Code, by adding Section 2A.54, to direct the**
4 **Planning Commission to prepare and submit a report to the Board of Supervisors**
5 **evaluating the provisions of the Planning Code related to the location of medical**
6 **cannabis dispensaries.**

11 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

12 Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that:

- 13 (a) Medical cannabis provides significant benefits to the residents of San Francisco;
- 14 (b) Medical cannabis dispensaries ("MCDs") may present unique challenges to the
15 communities within San Francisco in which they are located;
- 16 (c) Currently, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 209.3(k), 217(k), 790.141 and
17 890.133, MCDs are permitted only in certain zoning districts, and a parcel containing an MCD
18 must meet certain requirements, including but not limited to a requirement that such a parcel
19 cannot be located within 1000 feet from a parcel containing a public or private elementary or
20 secondary school or a community facility and/or recreation center that primarily serves
21 persons under 18 years of age;
- 22 (d) Current laws governing the location of MCDs have led to a concentration of
23 MCDs in a relatively small portion of the City;
- 24

1 (e) This concentration has resulted in varying impacts on the communities in which
2 MCDs are located; and

3 (f) Current laws governing the location of MCDs have resulted in limited access to
4 medical cannabis for patients in many parts of San Francisco.

5
6 Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding
7 Section 2A.54, to read as follows:

8 Section 2A.54. PLANNING COMMISSION EVALUATION OF MEDICAL CANNABIS
9 DISPENSARY LOCATION REGULATIONS.

10 (a) The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Planning Commission, by no later than
11 May January 1, 2014, to submit a written report to Board of Supervisors evaluating the impacts on
12 communities in which MCDs are located, and to make recommendations regarding whether Planning
13 Code provisions governing the location of MCDs, including but not limited to Planning Code Sections
14 209.3(k), 217(k), 790.141 and 890.133, should be amended. In this report, the Board of Supervisors
15 directs the Planning Commission to address the following considerations, at a minimum:

16 (1) The extent to which MCDs are concentrated in particular communities within
17 San Francisco;

18 (2) The nature and extent of effects of the location requirements for MCDs on
19 medical cannabis patients' access to medical cannabis;

20 (3) The nature and extent of effects of the location requirements for MCDs on the
21 public health, safety and welfare in the communities in which MCDs are located;

22 (4) Whether increased community input into the approval process to establish an
23 MCD would benefit the public health, safety and welfare, and, if so, what procedures would be most
24 effective in increasing such community input;

1 (5) Projected impacts on the public health, safety and welfare of expanding the
2 areas in which MCDs can be located; and

3 (6) Best operational practices that should be employed by MCDs to ensure the
4 public health, safety and welfare, including but not limited to minimum levels of security measures,
5 hours of operation, and location.

6 (b) In developing this report, the Board of Supervisors directs the Planning Commission
7 and/or Planning Department staff to consult as appropriate with City boards, commissions,
8 departments, entities, and officials, including but not limited to the Director of the Department of
9 Building Inspection, the Director of the Department of Public Health, the Chief of the Fire Department,
10 the Chief of the Police Department, and relevant community stakeholders, including existing permitted
11 medical cannabis dispensaries within the City and County of San Francisco.

12
13 Section 3.

14 (a) Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of
15 passage.

16 (b) Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board intends to amend
17 only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, letters,
18 punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, tables, or any other constituent part of the Planning
19 Code that are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment
20 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
21 the official title of the legislation.


22 (c) Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of
23 this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any
24 court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining
25 portions of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have

1 passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and
2 word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of
3 this ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

4 (d) Undertaking for the General Welfare. In enacting and implementing this
5 ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not
6 assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it
7 is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused
8 injury.

9 (e) No Conflict with State or Federal Law. Nothing in this ordinance shall be
10 interpreted or applied so as to create any requirement, power, or duty in conflict with any
11 federal or state law.

(11/5/2013, Amended in Board)

[Administrative Code - Planning Commission Review of Medical Cannabis Dispensary Location Regulations]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code by adding section 2A.54 to direct the Planning Commission to prepare and submit a report to the Board of Supervisors evaluating the provisions of the Planning Code related to the location of medical cannabis dispensaries.

Existing Law

There is currently no requirement to submit a report to the Board of Supervisors about Planning Code provisions addressing locations of medical cannabis dispensaries.

Amendments to Current Law

Section 2A.54 of the Administrative Code would direct the Planning Commission to prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors by May 1, 2014, a report evaluating the impacts of location requirements and restrictions for medical cannabis dispensaries ("MCDs") on the public health, safety and welfare, and to make recommendations regarding whether Planning Code provisions governing the location of MCDs should be amended. The Ordinance would direct the Planning Commission to address certain considerations in the report, and to consult with various City departments and community stakeholders in preparing the report.

Background Information

This purpose of this legislation is to direct the Planning Commission to study the effects of current requirements regarding the location of MCDs in the City on local communities and medical cannabis patients. The purpose of the study is to consider the benefits of MCDs for the residents of San Francisco, the accessibility of medical cannabis for patients in San Francisco, and the effects of MCDs on the communities where MCDs are allowed and concentrated.

Dear Supervisors:

Supervisor Avalos has proposed legislation to create the Excelsior Outer Mission Neighborhood Commercial (NC) District. This important legislation would add Outer Mission Street to the two-dozen or so commercial streets which have a named NC district specific to their corridor. A named NC district allows a neighborhood to customize its commercial district controls to meet specific neighborhood needs without the need for overlapping Special Use Districts.

The Excelsior Action Group (EAG) fully supports this important legislation. EAG is a volunteer-driven, community based, nonprofit organization that leads and implements a variety of community projects. We have been in existence since 2002, when neighbors got together to address issues of blight, economic inequality, and disinvestment. Today, we continue to respond to our community's ideas, projects and energy around our neighborhood's economic viability and diversity. EAG has chosen to pursue its mission by providing support for local merchants and through our community development projects.

We fully support this legislation, particularly the requirement to limit the location of Medical Cannabis Dispensaries (MCD). As proposed, a conditional use review would be required for MCDs applying to be located within 500 feet of an existing MCD, and

the hours of operation would be limited. We also understand that Supervisor Avalos may be proposing trailing legislation, which would require a conditional use review for MCDs applying to be located within 1000 feet of an existing MCD. While we suspect that you will hear howls of protest from the MCD community, please recognize that the residents and merchants who actually live, work, go to school, shop, and play in the neighborhood believe these common-sense restrictions are a crucial part of the legislation. While locating one MCD on a block may be acceptable, we have seen the quality of life in our neighborhood suffer, as multiple MCDs take over valuable commercial rental space and discourage other more family-oriented businesses from moving in. We very much need a variety of enterprises that serve the neighborhood needs on our commercial corridor.

We also support Supervisor Avalos's call for studying the "green zone" and the impact of clustering on our neighborhood, by directing the Planning Commission to prepare and submit a report to the Board of Supervisors to evaluate the provisions of the Planning Code related to the location of MCDs. We hope that a moratorium will be called on permitting any further MCDs on the entire Outer Mission Corridor, until that study is completed.

We are also very concerned about the proliferation of cyber cafes, which masquerade as providing business services but instead offer sweepstake, gambling games. These entities create very negative environments for our young people and residents are afraid to go near them. Nearby merchants in the area suffer from the lack of business, and a downward spiral is created. While Supervisor Avalos is working diligently with community groups and law enforcement to address this issue, we want to raise your awareness of our concerns and emphasize the harmful impact these establishments have on our commercial corridor. The proposed NC district legislation will at least allow the hours of these very problematic establishments to be limited. Again, EAG supports the proposed legislation, and we thank Supervisor Avalos for moving these proposals forward.
