

1 [Appointment, Children and Families First Commission - Amanda Pyle]

2 **Motion appointing Amanda Pyle (residency requirement waived), term ending October**
3 **8, 2026, to the Children and Families First Commission.**

5 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does
6 hereby appoint the hereinafter designated person to serve as a member of the Children and
7 Families First Commission, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative
8 Code, Sections 10.117-122, and 86.1 through 86.5, for the terms specified:

10 Amanda Pyle, seat 9 (residency requirement waived), succeeding Lynn Merz, term
11 expired, shall represent one or more of the categories specified in additional requirements
12 below, for a four-year term ending October 8, 2026 - Seats 8 and 9 shall be appointed among
13 the following categories:

14 Recipients of project services included in the Strategic Plan; educators specializing in
15 early childhood development; representatives of a local child care resource or referral agency,
16 local child care coordinating group; representatives of a local organization for prevention or
17 early intervention for families at risk; representatives of community-based organizations that
18 have the goal of promoting and nurturing early childhood development; representatives of
19 local school districts; and representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric associations
20 or societies. To the extent feasible, members shall be selected from existing committees,
21 councils, or coalitions promoting early childhood development and support of their families in
22 order to facilitate planning and coordination of services.; and, be it

23 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 24 1. The membership of the Children and Families First Commission has a goal to be
25 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.

2. Applicant Amanda Pyle, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Children and Families First Commission.
3. The Children and Families First Commission has attempted to fill the position, for which Amanda Pyle was nominated, with an individual who is City a resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Amanda Pyle, is qualified to serve on the Children and Families First Commission.
4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representatives, who is a resident of San Francisco, and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Children and Families First Commission at this time; and, be it FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Amanda Pyle, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101(a)(2), that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
