7	WHEREAS, Tourism plays a vital role in San Francisco's economy; and
8	WHEREAS, According to the Hotel Council, tourism adds 6.5 billion dollars into our
9	economy, provides more than 95,000 jobs, and provides hundreds of millions of dollars
10	in taxes for the city's operating expenses; and
11	WHEREAS, the Hotel Council has identified problems outside of the hotel industry that
12	they believe adversely affect San Francisco tourists; and
13	WHEREAS, A recent article in the San Francisco Chronicle identified unconscionable
14	practices within the hotel industry that exploit San Francisco tourists; and
15	WHEREAS, Certain San Francisco hotels are engaging in telephone call pricing
16	practices that directly affect San Francisco tourists; and
17	WHEREAS, a ten-minute local call is free from a home phone, 35 cents from a pay
18	phone, and over \$30 at certain San Francisco hotels; and
19	WHEREAS, a six-minute phone call to Japan costs less than a dollar using a 10-10
20	service but more than \$77 at a San Francisco hotel; and
21	WHEREAS, The burden of these outrageous prices falls disproportionately on
22	international travelers who may not have access to or understanding of alternatives to hotel
23	phones; and
