This letter provides counties with the allocations of the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023 Refugee Support Services (RSS) grant funding. The federal Office of Refugee Resettlement notified states of their RSS Formula Allocations on April 26, 2023 via Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) No. 23-21. Counties are authorized to provide services with this grant beginning October 1, 2023, and ending on September 30,2026.

Federal Allocation Methodology

The state's total FFY 2023 RSS funding is \$43,749,606. The Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) compiled the FFY 2021 and 2022 data from the Refugee Arrivals Data System to determine the total population served. ORR used Refugee arrival, Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) arrival, and Victims of Trafficking (VOT) data from federal sources, Cuban/Haitian Entrants and Asylee data submitted by states, and Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees arrival data from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and data submitted by states.

State Allocation Methodology

The amount of state administrative funds withheld from the total FFY 2023 RSS funding is 15 percent (\$6,562,441). The final funds to be allocated to the counties is \$35,327,807, after deducting \$1,859,358 (5 percent) for the San Diego Newcomer Project (SDNP) that is administered by Catholic Charities Diocese of San Diego. The FFY 2023 RSS allocations to the counties is based on the following formula:

- 40 percent of the final funds for the counties in the amount of \$14,131,123 was allocated using Medi-Cal Eligibility Data System report data, dated July 2023, using the following weighted formula:
 - A weight of 1.50 is applied to the number of refugees who have been in the United States (U.S) one year or less.
 - A Weight of 1.25 is applied to the number of refugees who have been in the U.S. two years or less, but more than one year.
 - A weight of 1.00 is applied to the number of refugees who have been in the U.S. five years or less, but more than two years.
- 30 percent of the final funds for the counties in the amount of \$10,598,342 was allocated based on the number of refugee and SIV arrivals per ORR's Refugee Arrival Data System (RADS), from October 1, 2021, through July 2023.
- 20 percent of the final funds to the counties in the amount of \$7,065,561 was allocated based on asylum grants between from October 1, 2017, through July 2023.
- 10 percent of the final funds to the counties in the amount of \$3,532,781 was allocated based on United for Ukraine (U4U) financial sponsor data from June 2022, through July 2023.

Eligible Counties

- Counties are eligible to receive RSS funds if they have resettled at least 300 refugee and SIV arrivals and Afghan Nationals, who came through the APA program, in the past five years.
- Counties that do not meet condition one, are eligible for RSS FFY 2023 if they have resettled more than 1,000 asylees in the past five years and more than 1,000 U4U applicants since the beginning of the United for Ukraine (U4U) program.

The counties eligible for FFY 2023 RSS funds receiving an allocation in this letter are: Alameda, Los Angeles, Orange, Sacramento, San Diego, San Francisco, Santa Clara, and Stanislaus.

Debarment and Suspension Requirements

Federal regulations require that individuals be restricted from receiving federal financial and non-financial assistance and benefits if they have been debarred or suspended pursuant to Title 2 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 180 and as supplemented with Part 376. Reasons for debarment/suspension may include a conviction for committing fraud or any other crime or action that shows a lack of business integrity (Subparts G and H for specific debarment/suspension criteria). The debarment/suspension requirements extend to an organization if a debarred/suspended individual is an officer, director, owner, partner, or if the individual has management or supervisory responsibility within the organization.

Counties are required to comply with the debarment and suspension provisions in 2 CFR Part 180 or 376 as a condition of receiving RSS funding. When arranging RSS-funded services through a subgrant or subcontract, counties must verify that the subgrantee or subcontractor is not excluded or disqualified from participation in federal assistance programs by:

- Checking the federal General Services Administration <u>System for Award</u> <u>Management</u>, which has the most current information about persons who have been excluded or disqualified for participation in federal programs; and/or
- 2) Adding a clause to the contract/agreement in which the contractor agrees to certify that he/she and his/her principals are not debarred or suspended from federal financial assistance programs and services. Example: "For federally funded agreements in the amount of \$25,000 or more, the Contractor certifies that he/she and his/her principals are not debarred or suspended from federal financial assistance programs and activities.

Federal Funding Terms and Conditions

All recipients and sub-recipients of federal funding, including RSS funding, are required to adhere to specific terms and conditions. See the terms and conditions Administrative Requirements, Section 2, for requirements when issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposal, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or part with federal money.
