WHEREAS, Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) is the leading killer in sub-Saharan Africa, home to 10 percent of the world's population but 70 percent of the world's HIV and AIDS cases, and the United Nations reports that in 1998, alone, more than 2,000,000 people in Africa died of HIV and AIDS; and

WHEREAS, A recent study by Doctors Without Borders concluded that, in industrialized countries where HIV and AIDS patients can afford to pay for drug therapy, AIDS-related mortality has decreased by more than 70 percent; and,

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, these life-prolonging treatments remain largely out of reach for most of Africa's population due to the high prices of these drugs; and,

WHEREAS, Certain companies' reaction to the HIV and AIDS epidemic in developing countries has been insufficient and significant restrictions have been imposed on the donation of critical drugs to HIV and AIDS patients in South Africa; and,

WHEREAS, For example, Pfizer attempted to impose time limits on the use of fluconazole, a drug used to treat potentially fatal fungal infections and a type of meningitis common among HIV and AIDS patients, even though fluconazole must be used over a patient's entire lifetime; these restrictions were unacceptable to the South African Government and the South African Medicines Control Council has recently given permission for the importation of a generic equivalent of fluconazole; and,

WHEREAS, The California Public Employees' Retirement System has invested nearly 6 billion dollars in the major manufacturers of HIV and AIDS drug treatments that can prolong the lives of individuals living with this disease; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors urge the California State Assembly to adopt Assembly Bill 55 introduced by Assemblywoman Carol Midgen, relating to an act to urge the Public Employees' Retirement System, as shareholders of pharmaceutical companies that develop HIV and AIDS drug treatments, to enact policy to provide affordable HIV and AIDS drug treatments to the majority of those infected with HIV and AIDS in less developed countries.
