WHEREAS, Charter Section 16.123-2 establishes the Public Education Enrichment Fund (the "fund") and designates one-third of the fund for universal access to preschool, one-third for sports, library, arts, and music programs and the remaining one-third of the fund, or in-kind services of equal value, for general education purposes; and

WHEREAS, the total allocation to the fund for FY 2006-07 is \$20 million; and WHEREAS, the allocation of the funds for universal access to preschool amounts to \$6,666,666 and is allocated to the City's First Five Commission; and

WHEREAS, the First Five Commission has proposed a plan to use the FY 2006-07 allocation of \$6,666,666 for preschool education, as prescribed by the Charter, to increase and improve preschool spaces, program development facility investments, and professional development of preschool teachers, and

WHEREAS, the Controller's Office has reviewed the expenditure plans and has provided comment to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco that it does hereby approve the expenditure plan as proposed by the San Francisco First Five Commission for FY 2006-07.
