THE ARONER-SCOTT CHILD GUN ACCIDENT PREVENTION ACT OF 1999; AND URGING

THE MAYOR TO URGE THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO ENACT STRICTER GUN

CONTROL LAWS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO SENATE BILL 23, SENATE BILL 15,

ASSEMBLY BILL 106 AND A LIMITATION ON GUN PURCHASES TO ONE PER PERSON

PER MONTH; AND REQUESTING THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE

FORWARDED TO HIS HONOR, THE MAYOR, WITH A REQUEST THAT HE TRANSMIT

COPIES TO THE MEMBERS OF THE STATE LEGISLATURE FROM SAN FRANCISCO

WITH A REQUEST THAT THEY TAKE ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO ACHIEVE THE

OBJECTIVES OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, in 1995, 14 children under the age of twenty were killed with a gun each day in the United States; and,

WHEREAS, Handguns are the number one killer of children in California; and,

WHEREAS, California has the highest rate of deaths caused by firearms of any state; and,

WHEREAS, more firearms are manufactured in California that in any other state; and,

WHEREAS, Californians purchase an average of 30,000 handguns per month; and,

WHEREAS, 80% of the medical cost for treatment of firearm related injuries is paid for by taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the California Police Chiefs Association has called for the registration of all transfers of possession of handguns; and

WHEREAS, California law currently does not prohibit the manufacture, sale and possession of "junk guns" or "Saturday Night Specials"; and,

WHEREAS, California law currently does not limit the possession of guns to one per person per month; and,

WHEREAS, California law currently requires that trigger locks be provided with the sale or transfer of each gun, but does not require trigger locks to be made of metal; and,

WHEREAS, California law currently does not require the mandatory registration of transfers of handguns, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to include within the Mayor's Legislative Policy support for Senate Bill 23 (Perata) banning assault weapons, Senate Bill 15 (Polanco) banning unsafe handguns; and Assembly Bill 106 (Scott) the Aroner-Scott Child Gun Accident Prevention Act of 1999;

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to urge the State Legislature to enact stricter gun control laws, including but not limited to Senate Bill 23, Senate Bill 15, Assembly Bill 106 and a limitation on gun purchases to one per person per month; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the members of the State Legislature from San Francisco with a request that they take all action necessary to achieve the objectives of this resolution.
