

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California Victim Compensation Board -
2 Criminal Restitution Compact - Not to Exceed \$275,391]

3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Office of the District Attorney to accept**
4 **and expend a grant in the amount of \$91,797 for the period of July 1, 2023,**
5 **through June 30, 2024; \$91,797 for the period of July 1, 2024, through June 30,**
6 **2025; and \$91,797 for the period of July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, for a total**
7 **not to exceed amount of \$275,391 from the California Victim Compensation Board**
8 **for the grant period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2026, to continue the Criminal**
9 **Restitution Compact should the parties agree to an amendment as allowed under**
10 **the provisions of the grant agreement.**

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12 WHEREAS, Since at least July 1, 2000, the California Victim Compensation
13 Board (“CVCB”) awarded the City and County of San Francisco through the Office of
14 the District Attorney funds for the purpose of working with the criminal justice system to
15 determine appropriate imposition of restitution fines and orders; said file is with the
16 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 001454; and

17 WHEREAS, The Office of the District Attorney desires to enter into an agreement
18 with CVCB in accordance with Government Code, Section 13835 for the purpose of
19 ensuring that restitution fines and orders are properly administered; and

20 WHEREAS, CVCB prohibits the City and County of San Francisco from using the
21 funds to supplant local funds that would, in the absence of California Victim
22 Compensation Board Programs, be made available to support the assistance of victims
23 and witnesses of crime; and

24 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors provided in Section 11.1 of the
25 administrative provisions of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2026 Annual Appropriation

1 Ordinance that approval of recurring grant funds contained in departmental budget
2 submission and approved in the FY 2023-2026 budget are deemed to meet the
3 requirements of the Administrative Code regarding grant approvals; and

4 WHEREAS, The California Victim Compensation Board that provides grant funds
5 to the Office of the District Attorney requires documentation of the Board's approval of
6 its Criminal Restitution Compact funds; and

7 WHEREAS, All positions supported by these funds shall be coded "G" in the
8 District Attorney's budget; and

9 WHEREAS, The District Attorney proposes to maximize use of available grant
10 funds for program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; and

11 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an amendment to the Annual Salary
12 Ordinance (ASO); now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco,
14 or his designee, is authorized on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco to
15 contract for, and accept and expend funds from the California Victim Compensation
16 Board to continue the Criminal Restitution Compact, including any extensions,
17 augmentations or amendments thereof; and, be it

18 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion
19 of indirect costs in the grant budget.
